 - Prioritise support, education and resources for individual and sector improvement
- Members and participants - who expect sport, at every level, to be administered with the highest level of integrity and good governance

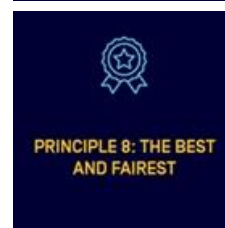

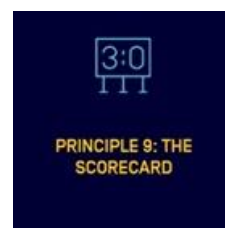

The SNT Board in conjunction with the CEO has worked tirelessly to raise our Governance standards in the time proceeding the initial self-audit. This includes the review and establishment of all SNT Policies, increased Board documentation, including the introduction of a Board Charter, Director Code of Conducts, Induction Policy and Procedure, Board Management Guidelines, Board Evaluation Policy as well as SNT Financial and Non-Financial delegations.

In addition to this, the Board of Swimming Northern Territory has outlined new required sub-committees and their associated Charters to assist in the running of the organisation. These include a Risk and Audit Sub-Committee, a Finance Sub-Committee and a Governance Sub-Committee. In addition to this, the Board has approved a new Risk Management Framework that will lead to the identification, recording, mitigation and controls relating to risk that will safeguard the sport of swimming into the future.

There is still some work to do that will enable Swimming Northern Territory to be a sports governance leader in the Northern Territory, as well as in the sport of swimming throughout Australia, including:

- ✚ Filling the roles within the sub-committees with suitably qualified members.
- ✚ Finalising the establishment of and charters for a technical subcommittee, strategic planning subcommittee and a competition and development subcommittee.
- ✚ Constitutional reform to ensure the optimal framework for SNT to operate.
- ✚ Establishing a thorough risk register and subsequent control plans to safeguard the organisation and sport in the NT.
- ✚ Work on the SNT's ongoing success through the establishment of succession plans, procedural guidelines, Board and committee training and clear strategic and commercial planning.

We will be shortly reaching out to members and the business community in order to fulfil these important roles that can solidify the organisations successes and ongoing growth into the future. If you feel you may be able to assist, please reach out.

CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER REPORT

I am happy to present the 2023-24 Swimming Northern Territory CEO Report, as part of the SNT Annual Report, my second in this very challenging, but rewarding position as the CEO of Swimming Northern Territory. The last 12 months have been incredibly busy for both the organisation and myself personally, however, I truly believe that the sport of swimming in the NT is heading in the right direction, and the speed at which it is currently getting there is faster than I could ever have imagined.

Looking back 12 months I can honestly say that I was very proud of the achievements that we, as an organisation, had accomplished in the first 6 months of my tenure, however, we were only just getting started. The last 12 months have been a whirlwind of activity and breakthroughs that are providing opportunities and experiences for swimmers, coaches and technical officials in our sport here in the NT and will do into the future.

The last year has provided some clarity around the opportunities available to swimming in the NT, including the prospect to build better relationships with the NT Government and local councils, but also to work with and utilise the existing sports here in the NT for a more collaborative approach to participation, competition and governance. However, as I get to know the Territory more, it has also highlighted the difficult realities of operating a sporting organisation, especially for our regional members. The vastness of the NT make it extremely difficult to be able to deliver engaging resources and assistance to our regional and remote clubs and members, while also providing a level of support that is commensurate with the Darwin-based clubs. One of my goals for the 12 months ahead is to work harder with the regions to develop those clubs and provide enough support that enables swimmers and club committees in these communities better prospects.

A large focus area in the last year has been to work with the Board of Swimming Northern Territory to improve governance practices. This will not only ensure the sport is more effectively and efficiently managed, but also to provide a level of protection for our Board, our staff, our clubs, our members, our volunteers and any other stakeholder. As you can see from the Governance section in the report above, there has been an enormous amount of work done that has led to significant improvement in our Sports Governance Standards results (self-audited). My aim is to keep working to ensure we are the best run sport in the NT, which will have enormous benefits, in terms of building better and more fruitful relationships with the government and corporate sector. Benefits of this will lead to a more sustainable level of commercial viability, enabling the chance to provide enormous support to our stakeholder, empowering them to reach their desired potential in this great sport.

Financially, there has been significant movement on both sides of the ledger, where we have tried to enhance the commercial and financial success of the organisation through revenue growth, but also to limit or eliminate wasted resources (the details are briefed below and the audited financial statements are at the end of this annual report). There have been significant cost savings made over the last year and my plan is to continue to eliminate waste when found and ensure that we are operating optimally.

Personally, I am most passionate about development, through the provision of unique and incredible experiences and possibilities for swimmers, coaches and technical officials that will enrich their time in the sport and enable experiences that will benefit and bring joy to them throughout their life. Swimmers, coaches and volunteers give up so much time and put in enormous efforts to participate in, train and manage swimming that it is my duty to ensure that they are provided with the best levels of support, encouragement, and opportunity to succeed, in their own way. One of the biggest successes of the year as been the establishment of the 4-tiered SNT Performance Pathways Program. This program was developed through consultation with Swimming Australia and other state swimming organisations. The program outlines the basis for providing a clear pathway for swimmers to reach the level they wish to – even if it is to represent Australia at the Olympics. Working with this foundation, SNT will build an optimal level of team trips, camps, clinics and helpful advice, depending on requirements that will be beneficial to all participants in this program. The highlight was the first ever SNT Flippers camp, held in February, with thanks to Swimming Australia, Mel Tantrum and all those that contributed.

Finally, there is a move towards community sport within the Australian sporting landscape and this is an area that has enormous potential for swimming. A huge number of people throughout Australia (estimated at nearly 6million people on a weekly basis), and indeed in the NT, swim in some capacity, however, membership numbers as a percentage of this group are miniscule. Swimming, including SNT, needs to better engage with our swimming community, as a whole, not just the competitive aspect of it. That includes the learn to swim industry, the open water swimmers, the swim for fitness community and members of other aquatic based sports, such as artistic swimming, diving, Masters swimming and Water Polo. Bringing these areas closer together and providing useful engagement can only benefit everyone.

Sport in Australia presently has enormous potential, with the upcoming Olympics in Brisbane in 2032. The chance exists to build a framework that will bring success in the short-term, and provide a foundation that will enable long-term viability and sustainability for swimming, the most popular Olympic sport. My aim is to utilise this once in a generation opportunity to raise the status of swimming in the NT, while promoting its incredible health and social benefits to the wider Northern Territory community.

Membership

An important step in growing the sport in the NT, increasing participation and opportunity is through growing our reach, our footprint and our serviceability. This year we achieved an enormous 27.8% growth in overall membership and a 32.2% growth in swimmer membership. The potential for further growth exists in future years due to the reopening of both the Palmerston Swell complex, as well as the Casuarina Aquatic Centre. However, negatively, we have had both the Katherine and Kununurra pools close recently, but the prospects of 2 new centres opening in the medium term is fantastic.

Additionally, SNT will be looking to improve program delivery, especially in schools to provide kids with the pathway into a swimming club and onto the world of competitive swimming.

Partners & Sponsors

As the peak sporting body for swimming in the Northern Territory, we are responsible for the ongoing success of the sport. We would be unable to do this without the incredible support we receive from all of our partners and sponsors.



The biggest financial supporter of Swimming Northern Territory is the Northern Territory Government. This year, apart from numerous opportunities in governance, management and other sports related programs, the NTG has significantly assisted SNT financially, through our Peak Sporting Body Funding, through the NT Sports Academy support of our technical officials, the Health department support of our All-Abilities program, as well as, of course the funding from the NT Major Events Company to enable the inaugural Country Swimming Championships in October. The NT Government is vitally important to Swimming here in the Northern Territory and we thank them enormously.

The Australian Federal Government continued to support SNT through the continued funding of the Social Inclusion and Physical Activity program (eNTry) throughout the entire Territory. This program has been running for several years and enabled SNT to provide swimming sessions, teaching fundamental skills throughout 8 identified Indigenous community hubs. This year was the final year of funding for this project, that has created wonderful experiences for participants across the Territory.



Australian Government



The City of Darwin is also a fantastic contributor to Swimming Northern Territory through the provision of aquatic facilities, such as Parap and Nightcliff pools, as well as the rebuilding of Casuarina pool. In addition to this, the City of Darwin was the major sponsor of the 2023 City of Darwin NT Open and Age Championships, held in March. In addition to their financial support of this event, the City of Darwin also provided enormous in-kind support, waiving pool hire fees. Thank you to the City of Darwin.

McDonald's has been a long-time supporter of Swimming Northern Territory and they again provided both financial and in-kind support to the organisation. This sponsorship has been in existence for over 10 years and enables SNT to run our Come and Try Meets, as well as providing many benefits to our swimmers and families via free food vouchers. Thank you to McDonalds for their incredible ongoing support.



Additionally, we welcomed Team Elite as a first-year sponsor. Team Elite provided financial support to Swimming Northern Territory this year. In addition, we have utilised their expertise to provide incredible medals to the swimmers, as well as wonderful merchandise that has been very quickly snapped up and appreciated by our swimmers and their families. The commitment Team Elite has shown over the year to SNT has been fantastic and we hope that this is a long-lasting partnership.



Finances

The audited financial statements for the 2023-24 financial year and the auditors report can be found at the end of this annual report. It is pleasing to note that SNT has recorded a moderate surplus of \$49,212 for the 2023-24 financial year, following last year's small surplus of \$12,877. Given there was a budgeted deficit planned of \$20,792, this \$70k turnaround is a fantastic result. The aim is to continue to build small surpluses into the future to aid in the long-term commercial viability of the organisation.

Pleasingly, we have successfully secured a small increase in funding from the NT Government for the next 5 years as part of a new funding agreement signed for the 2024-2029 period. In addition to this, there have been slight increases in funding from Swimming Australia in the short term. These increases, mainly in the areas of coach and swimmer development will greatly assist in providing quality development opportunities, especially for coaches and swimmers to the NT.

The next plan for SNT is to greatly increase our operations commercially within the business and government sectors. Hopefully, this will be the injection we need to expand our offerings to our regional clubs and members, through programs such as the Athlete Development program, as well as the Regional Development Program

Volunteers

I would like to sincerely thank each and every person that has assisted SNT operate this year for all that you have done in giving up your time and/or expertise to make this sport as great as it is. Your involvement is fundamental to the success of this great sport. So, from the timekeepers to the medal presenters to the announcers and everyone in between – THANK YOU.

Additionally, I must acknowledge and pay tribute to our wonderful Technical Officials. This year, SNT was most fortunate to have Katherine Reynolds step into the Technical Manager role and has transformed the culture and knowledge within the entire team. Kate has vast experience and is a current World Aquatics Open Water Referee who has officiated at many state and national meets and brings this experience to our dedicated, highly competent and fun-loving team. Technical officials aim to make the sport fair for all and without them, our sport wouldn't be possible. Thank you.

Activities

There has been a wealth of activities over the last 12 months, and they are all listed below for review. However, it has been particularly pleasing to see the development in our younger swimmers and I am excited for the future. Another highlight was the running of our first ever SNT Flipper Camp and the development of the Performance Pathways Program to propel competitive swimming forward in the NT. But, to see the growth in our top-tier swimmers, both able-bodied and multi-class and the results that are being achieved on a national level are incredible. To be a part of swimming in the NT for Macey Sheridan to have won 11 Gold and 1 Silver medal over the last 2 years and 2 more swimmers in Sahrah Hancock and James Smith adding to that number this year has been exhilarating. Macey's inclusion into the Australia Flippers Squad, the first ever Northern Territory swimmer to do so and the youngest ever, is a huge achievement and one that I believe will be the catalyst for swimming in the NT to become a huge part of Australia's future success. Congratulations to everyone involved.

Finally, to the entire Board of Swimming Northern Territory, I would like to express my gratitude again for providing me with this opportunity to grow swimming in the Northern Territory and give all participants the opportunity to make the most of their time in our sport. I have put an enormous amount of information in front of the Board this year and they have all stood up to work harder, make me accountable, and ensured that the sport is well managed. I would also like to offer an enormous thank you to the outgoing President of SNT, Megan Gallagher, who is a great sounding board, provider of local knowledge and someone who is passionate about this sport in the NT. Megan has handled a huge workload since taking over this volunteer position in February and has kept me on-track, provided great advice and been an incredible blessing for me and SNT. Megan is stepping off the board this year and her enthusiasm, guidance and understanding of swimming in the NT will be profoundly missed.

Swimming is an incredible sport with incredible lifelong health and social benefits, however, as a sport, it can be demanding and unforgiving, yet incredibly rewarding. I want to dedicate my time in this role to providing the best experiences and the greatest opportunities to our swimmers, coaches and technical officials that will harness a lifelong love of swimming. There is a long and winding road ahead, but I hope it is a journey that I can make worthwhile and enjoyable for everyone involved in this great sport.

Swimming NT Sub Committees

During the 2023-24 season, the SNT Board has implemented the following Sub Committees that are required to fulfil our governance obligations. The Board, in conjunction with the CEO have developed applicable charters for each of these sub-committee written to clearly define the respective roles, responsibilities, and authorities of each Board sub-committee.

The developed sub-committees are:

- Risk & Audit Sub-committee
- Finance Sub-committee
- Governance Sub-committee

In addition to these sub-committees, SNT are bound to have the following Sub-committees as per the SNT Constitution Part 4 Division 4:

- Selection Sub-committee
- Competition Sub-committee
- Technical Sub-committee
- Athlete and Coach Development Sub-committee

In recent years, these sub-committees have not been adhered to as there have not been enough people / members volunteer in order to fulfil these requirements. The undertakings of these sub-committees has been taken on by the CEO to ensure that work in these areas continues, while the SNT Technical Manager, Katherine Reynolds has overseen the roles defined for the technical sub-committee.

At this point in time, SNT is looking to reform the Technical Sub-committee, combine the Selection, Competition and Athlete & Coach Development Sub-committee into the Competition and Development Sub-committee. Charters for each of these sub-committees will be developed in the new season and implemented as soon as possible, provided we find willing volunteers that are willing to assist SNT in the management and oversight of these areas.

In order to fulfil governance requirements and guide SNT towards optimal results in all aspects of swimming we require the invaluable investment of volunteers in these areas. If you are interested, please contact SNT.

TECHNICAL MANAGER REPORT

July 1st, 2023 – June 30th, 2024

Swimming NT (SNT) Technical Officiating has had a stabilising year with a focus on technical development. SNT Officiating has also been building its reputation for excellence nationally, in tandem with our swimmers. Both Kate Reynolds, our Technical Manager, and Warren Dopson, our CEO were appointed to various National Meets throughout the year. SNT proved it is at the forefront when it comes to using technology to support the smooth running of meets. NT have adopted the use of QR Codes for swimmer check-in for distance events and scratching from events. The process was fully developed for the 2023 Country Swimming Championships and has been in place ever since for NT State level meets. Warren Dopson demonstrated the NT process to the SwimAus Technical Manager, it was trialed at Age supported by Warren and Kate. The distance events check-In process has now been adopted by Swimming Australia at all their national meets. The scratching process is getting traction. Kudos to Swimming NT.


2023 Country Swimming Championships created another exciting development year for officiating. Now in its second year, it is beginning to get traction as the “Gap Filler” for the aborted State Teams event, which was used by officiating to give up-and-coming officials exposure to a national event. This year we had a 69% increase of self-funded Officials from across the nation attend the Meet.

Following the success of 2022 Country Championships half day development session; NT Technical Manager partnered CORP Workplace Solutions (EASA), Swimming QLD and Swimming WA Officiating to deliver a content packed, full day's training day for the officials. The training was then backed up by opportunities for Officials to develop those skills on pool deck at the 2023 Country Swimming Championships. The Training Day was held at the Parap Village Tavern and was attended by 23 officials. Feedback for the day was 4.5/5 with special mention of the Protests and Juries session. Congratulations to Howie Young who achieved his JOS and IOT qualifications during the Championships.

SNT ran two Open Water events which were held at the Darwin Waterfront including the 2023 SNT Open Water Championships. 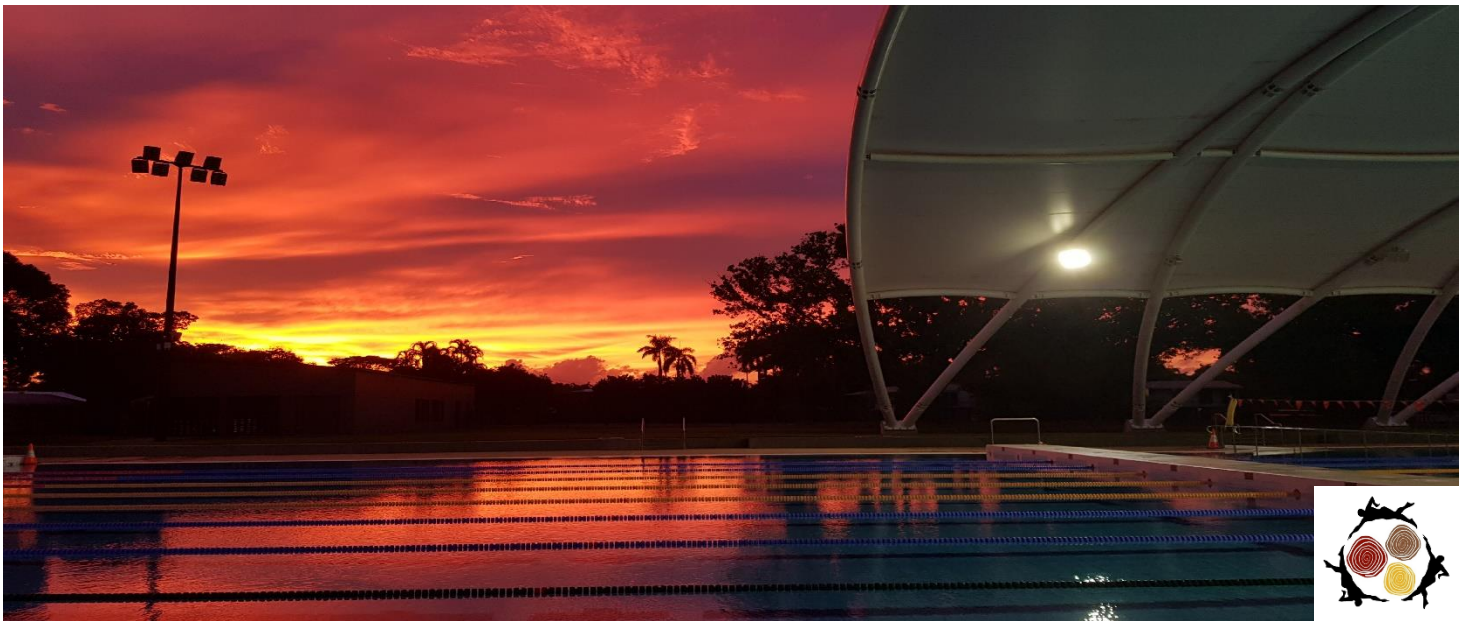

2023 Country Swimming Championships



After a successful launch of the Country Swimming Championships in 2022, the event was again conducted in 2023 with great success by Swimming Northern Territory (SNT) from 30th September – 3rd October 2023, at Parap Pool, in Darwin. The underlying premise of this event is to attract swimmers from regional and remote areas around Australia to participate in a Championship event designed to provide valuable experiences in their swimming journey that, without this event, just doesn't occur on a national level in Australia.



Event Delivery Review

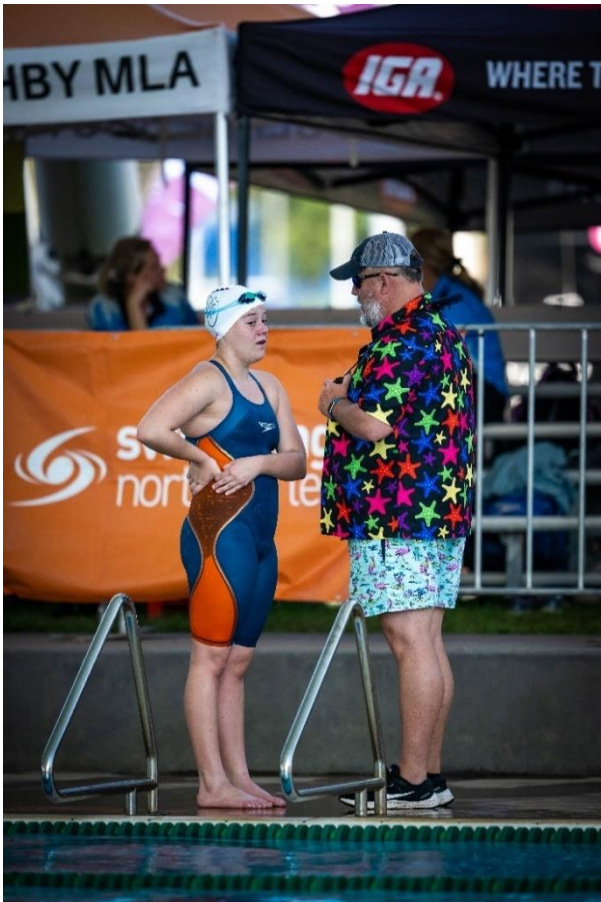
SNT were able to successfully organise the event once again, marketing the Championship to targeted swimmers and their families around the country through the addition of an event specific website, promotion through other state swimming bodies and significant social media advertising and direct email marketing campaigns. As such, we were able to attract a substantial number of participants and conduct the event that was lauded by all relevant stakeholders, including swimmers, coaches, technical officials, Government and Council members, club volunteers and members of the SNT community as an incredible event, much improved from the 2022 version. In addition to the swimming organisations involved, we had incredible support from the Northern Territory Major Events Company (NTMEC), who provided substantial financial support which enabled this event to be the triumph it was.

Operationally, Swimming Northern Territory is a very small team, however, we were able to attract 281 swimmers (incl. 168 from interstate) from 59 clubs from each state within Australia, except Tasmania. In addition, this the event drew over 38 coaches, 29 Technical officials and a further 400-450 individual spectators on a daily basis. Additionally, funding this year allowed us to plan for more activities, expanding the event by an extra day to encourage more direct visitor nights in the NT through the addition of a Junior swimmers JX clinic, supported by Swimming Australia, a SNT Senior Swimmers Clinic, a Technical Official Workshop, run by 3 leading World Aquatics officials and a Women’s Health Initiative, in partnership with Territory Sports Medicine, that was open to all female attendees and their female guardians. These events were a great addition to the overall Championships and were greatly supported by all attending., spearheaded by the 2023 event ambassador, Olympic Gold Medalist and World Record Holder – Chelsea Hodges.

A total of 164 different events in the Championships themselves were conducted, consisting of 407 heats, with a total of 3,427 swims over the 4 days. Overall, the event was a huge success, which highlighted the ability of the NT swimming community to come together and conduct an incredibly successful national event. Whilst numbers were expected to be a little down on last year, given the extreme cost of airfares and cost of living pressures that were beginning to take hold, the event was still a huge success, with those visiting proclaiming it to be one, if not the best swim meet they had ever attended. Which is remarkable feedback and something SNT is very proud of.

It is vitally important for SNT and the sporting community to embrace this event in future years to provide incredible opportunities for NT swimmers, but for sport in the NT overall.





Swimming Northern Territory is very lucky to have great sponsorship partners, including the NT Government, City of Darwin, McDonald's, Team Elite and Darwin Corporate Park and specifically for this event Parap Tavern that provided some cash and in-kind funding to assist in the running of the event. McDonalds, in particular were a great in-kind supporter of the event, as were all local area politicians from both sides of the chamber.

One of the SNT sponsors, Team Elite provided the event merchandise, which was an incredible success, selling out after Day 3 of the event. Team Elite also supply our medals as part of an overarching sponsorship arrangement.



As per last year, being able to develop, build and then manage an event this size certainly upskilled SNT staff in the areas of event management, marketing, risk and safety management, financial planning, budgeting and event accounting, which will greatly benefit the delivery of outstanding sporting events within the Northern Territory into the future. This event had significantly better feedback from all participants and attendees than the 2022 event.

Further to this and possibly the most significant benefit, socially and culturally to come out of this event was the self-belief that it generated, not only within those that managed the event, but also to the participants. There was a great sense of comradery and friendship around the pool that you don't normally get at national level meets. The swimmers interacted incredibly well with each other, and many lifelong friendships were formed. As previously mentioned, most regional based swimmers are not afforded the same opportunities as capital city and urban-based athletes due to lack of adequate facilities, lack of development opportunities for the swimmers and their coaches and the challenge of distance, amongst many others. Feedback received from parents after the completion of this year's event was the enormous growth in self-belief within the swimmers, especially those that were able to medal at a "national" event, but also to those that made finals, having never previously believed this was possible. In a time of diminishing confidence and self-belief in adolescents, this sense of pride and accomplishment in these swimmers is possibly the greatest achievement of this event and hopefully has longer lasting benefits to the mental health of these regional-based swimmers.

Community Engagement

Swimming events generally do not engage the local community outside the actual swimming community and their extended families. However, this 2023 event engaged a large portion of the community, with swimmers interacting at the Parap Markets, the Mindil Beach Markets, Parap Tavern and other venues throughout the city. As mentioned above, NT swimmers do feel a sense of isolation and feelings



that they are not able to compete with the rest of the country, however, this event provided the local swimmers with the opportunity to compete with swimmers from around Australia with similar ability and they performed exceptionally well.

In addition to this, the local swimming community volunteers that assisted in the event setup and running, did so with a sense of pride and accomplishment. The event would not have been possible without the local volunteers and Swimming Northern Territory is enormously grateful for their efforts.



National Exposure & Media Analysis

The 2023 Country Swimming Championships had an enormous amount of coverage around Australia with multiple television spots on the ABC and Channel 9 in Darwin, as well as WIN in areas like Bendigo, Wangaratta and Toowoomba that presented the event to follow their regions swimmers. There were also multiple radio interviews with Mix104.9 in Darwin, as well as stations in Bendigo and Broome. In addition to this there was multiple stories in the NT News, including the back page of the printed paper, the multiple page coverage of all results as well as a 2-page spread showcasing the event and providing many photos. There were also daily updates in the digital media space, as well as significant promotion on our social media channels with over 25,000 impressions and over 4000 content interactions. Our purpose-built event website also generated over 12,000 site visits.

While the activity and engagement were high, Swimming Northern Territory are looking to significantly improve the national exposure of the NT as a must do destination in future events.

Overall, the 2023 Country Championships was a phenomenal success for SNT swimmers, the NT and Darwin community and for the sport of swimming in the Territory as a whole. Bring on 2024!!!

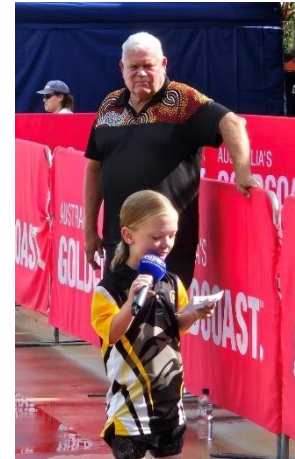

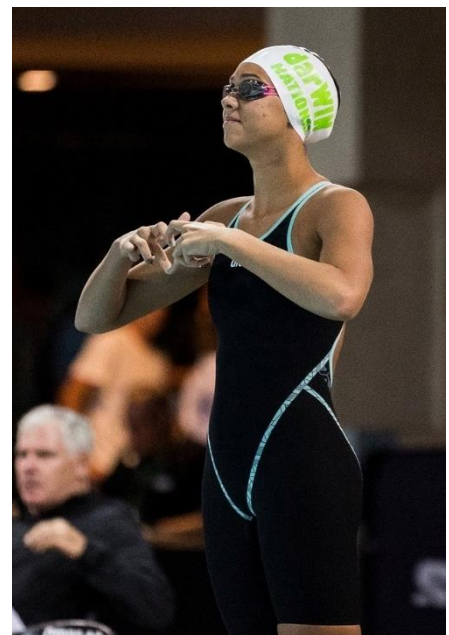

Macey picked up 5 Gold medals and 1 Silver medal to again be the swimmer with the greatest number of both Gold medals and overall medals in the entire Championships. Macey won Gold in the 50m, 100m and 200m Backstroke, as well as the 50m and 100m Freestyle, while picking up her silver in the 50m Butterfly.



Other incredible achievements included a bronze medal from James Smith in the 800m Freestyle, as well as finishing 4th in the 1500m freestyle and 9th in the 400m Freestyle. Again, outstanding effort and reward. Also picking up a finalist spot was Bayleigh Young, who finished 7th in the 200m Butterfly, after recording a huge PB to get in to the final. Congratulations to all 3 swimmers.

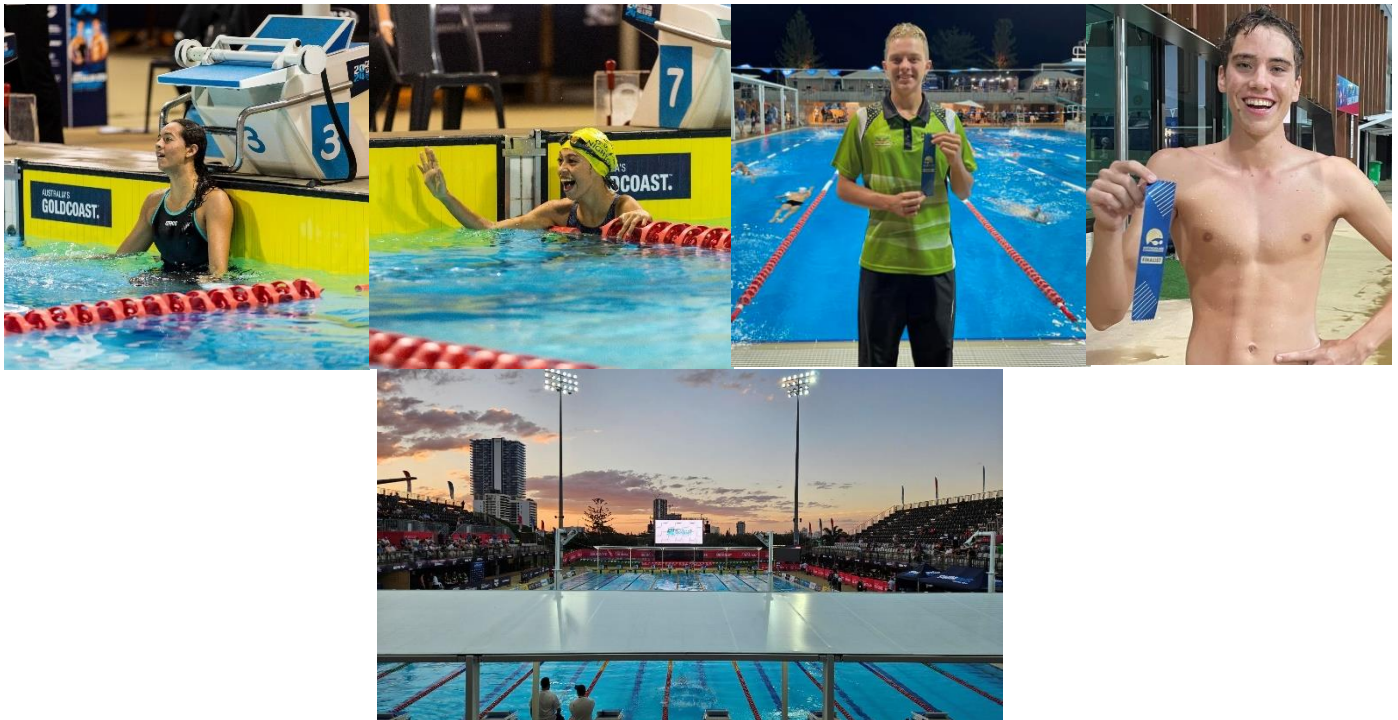

The SNT Technical Manager, Kate Reynolds and SNT CEO, Warren Dopson were both on pool deck for the duration of the meet and had a great time promoting the sport in the NT, especially the Country Championships to TO's and coaches from around the country.

Qualifying for an Australian Olympic Trials is close to the pinnacle of the sport here in Australia and for 2 swimmers from Darwin Swimming Club to achieve this is incredible. The atmosphere was unbelievable, the talent in the pool was a who's who of the best swimmers in the world and both Macey and James achieved what is only a dream for many swimmers. As such, in total, this represents a total of 1,933 swimmer entries for NT meets, entering a massive 9045 events throughout the season. This is a slight increase of 7 swimmers, however, with 1 less event on the 2023-24 swim meet calendar. It does however represent an increase in 1046.

McDonalds Splash & Dash Events

The McDonalds Splash and Dash events are an opportunity for non-members or non-competitive club members to come and give swimming a go in a fun and supportive environment. These events are designed to rotate through facilities to enable each club to showcase themselves to the wider community. The 2023/2024 season only conducted one McDonalds Splash and Dash events which occurred in Katherine on the 9th September and welcomed approximately 30 participants. This session was greatly supported and run by the swimmers from Darwin Swimming Club who travelled to Katherine to provide some insight, tips and swimming experiences for the Katherine community.



We are looking at greatly expanding the Come and Try events throughout the NT over the next 18 months to ensure ALL clubs have access to these events, but also to provide kids in areas such as Tennant Creek and Boorooloola the opportunity to participate in these activities and gain important life skills and a love of the water.

Can we also say a huge thank you to McDonald's who have provided us with some great incentives to help reward those children that turn up, have a great time and look to build a future in swimming.



SNT Development

The 2023-24 season has been a big year for the development of Swimmers, Coaches and Technical Officials in the NT.

It all started with a plethora of development activities as part of the 2023 Country Swimming Championships, with development opportunities for all 3 facets of our community.

The Pho3nix Foundation JX Clinic, led by Chelsea Hodges, Macey Sheridan, Sienna Walo and Tamsyn Walo was a huge success, with 103 swimmers from the NT and across regional Australia taking part in a huge land-based activation session, run by SNT Supporters - Territory Sports Medicine, followed by an athlete talk from the previously mentioned superstars of Australian and NT swimming. After that, a raft of coaches from the NT and around Australia led sessions to improve swimmers dives and turns. The feedback was fantastic and the line-up to get a photo and autograph from Chelsea Hodges was quite special. Thank you to everyone that assisted in making this clinic a great event.



At the same time, the technical officials were holding a full day Technical Official Training Day led by our very own SNT Technical Manager Kate Reynolds, as well as current World Aquatics appointees, Kaye Bolger (WA) and Sarah Emery (QLD). The training centred around conflict management, protests and juries and the adaptability around regional officiating. Attended by 23 TO's including many from the NT, there was a lot to learn.

Following on from here was the opportunity to learn and be mentored, not only by the abovementioned officials, but also from other previously appointed World Aquatics officials – Dot Harris (WA), Stella Carrara (WA), Cherry Smith (NSW) and Pam Weste (NSW).

On the final day was the Development Coach Course run by SNT in conjunction with Swim, Coaches and Teachers Association (SCTA). Led by SCTA Executive Officer Gary Toner, the course enables participants to learn the requirements to become a Development Coach, which is the first level of Swimming Australia's coaching hierarchy. Thanks to the participants, Gabrielle Dans (Nightcliff), Greg Miller (Katherine) and Sienna Dopson (QLD) for taking part, as well as the 6 kids from Darwin Swim Club that assisted our training coaches throughout the afternoon.

Further opportunity was provided to SNT TO Adam Walo, when he was offered the opportunity to travel to QLD for the 2023 QLD Championships in December to be a part of the SQ Technical Official Mentor Program. Being instructed by a Swimming Australia Assessor and working with some of Australia's best officials was invaluable to Adam and SNT looks forward to being able to provide more of these opportunities to our technical officials in the years ahead.

A second Pho3nix Foundation JX Clinic was conducted as part of the visiting High-Performance Camp with the Southport Olympic Swim Club in April 2024. Again, we had a great turnout of 48 NT swimmers come along for some skills fine-tuning and to learn from Southport Olympic Head Coach and Australian Coach Sean Eels. Run by the swimmers from Southport Olympic, including a few familiar faces in Chelsea Hodges, Sienna and Tamsyn Walo, the swimmers had a Q&A session with Chelsea and Sean

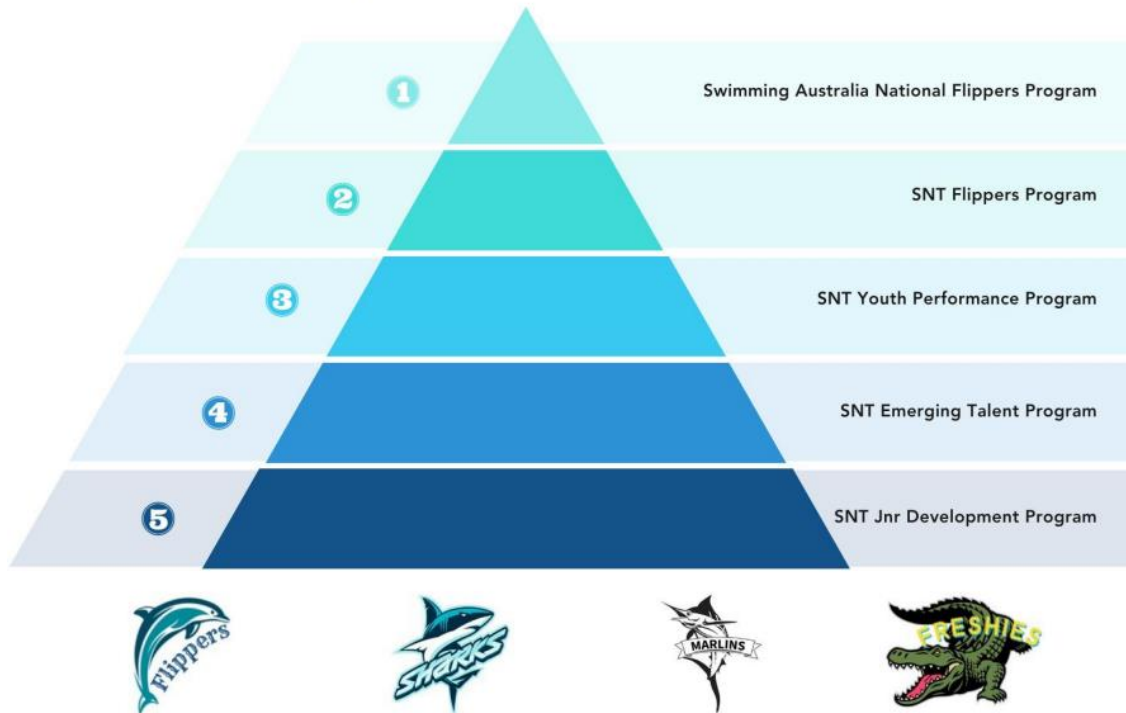


before hitting the water. These consistent clinic sessions are an excellent way to hear a potentially new perspective and maybe get some new tips and tricks. Thank you to the NT swimmers for continuing to support these activities and to Southport Olympic for their contribution to the improvement of swimming in the NT.

Extensive work has been done throughout the 2023-24 season to put together a development program that will enhance swimmers in the NT and provide them with a clear pathway in order to support them achieve their goals in swimming. At the start of the 2024 calendar year the Swimming Northern Territory Performance Pathway Program was born. Part of this was the first ever SNT Flippers squad, which is the pinnacle of youth swimming in Australia. In addition to this, Macey Sheridan was added to the Australian Flippers Squad, at the age of 13, being the youngest member ever. Well done Macey.

Swimming Northern Territory has developed the SNT Performance Pathway Programs to identify and develop SNT swimmers and coaches with the determination of providing the tools and knowledge to achieve their goals and fulfil their potential, both in and out of the pool. The purpose of this performance pathway program is to ultimately prepare swimmers to be future Australian Dolphins through the provision of a variety of activities that add value to their daily training environment.

Swimming Northern Territory Performance Pathway



Working within Swimming Australia’s ‘Australian Swimmer Framework’, developed in conjunction with the Australian Institute of Sport, the goal of the SNT Performance Pathway Programs is to provide swimmers and coaches with a clearly structured pathway of progression towards fulfilling their ultimate potential through the creation, management and provision of innovative and exciting educational and enhancement opportunities in swimming and life. Through the establishment of talent identification and baseline testing activities, seminar and workshop activities from our Premium Partners, exceptional coach mentoring and development and superior skills clinics for both para and able-bodied swimmers, these programs are designed to ensure every opportunity available is provided to empower the experiences of each participant on the journey towards Brisbane 2032.

In order to ease into the program, the decision was made to invite swimmers to the top two tiers for the first 6 months (Jan – Jun 24) in order to focus on developing the strategy, to allow optimal performance.

The highlight of this program was the implementation of the first ever SNT Flippers Camp, which took place over the weekend of the LC Qualifying Meet in February. The Camp, supported by Swimming Australia, was led by the Swimming Australia Technical Lead for WA and SA, Mel Tantrum who provided valuable insight into elite age group performance and conducted a total of 6 in-water session from Friday to Monday, as well as a session on exercise physiology and activations, nutrition, sports psychology and a strength and conditioning session. It was a jam-packed weekend with additional involvement in a few of the session opened up to swimmers in the Youth Performance Program as well. It was a great insight into different training methodologies and skills that all swimmers got a huge amount out of. Thank you to all involved and we look forward to conducting a better camp in 2025. Additional support from Paralympics Australia Pathway Specialist Natalie Charlton was also welcomed.



On a more individual basis, as part of her inclusion into the Australian Flippers Squad, Macey Sheridan and her coach, Tim Few were invited to partake in the Swimming NSW / Swimming VIC Flippers Camp that took place at the Australian Institute of Sport (AIS) in November, along with being invited to the Swimming Australia NextGen Backstroke Camp, also at the AIS in February. The NextGen camps are designed to upskill and prepare the next generation of swimmers to potentially be ready to represent Australia at the LA Olympics in 2028.



Right at the end of the season, Sahrah Hancock and her coach Jane Davies were invited to the Swimming Qld para camp on the Sunshine Coast. The camp, with approx. 10 other high-performance para-swimmers was an invaluable opportunity for both Sahrah and Jane to see how other athletes training and prepare themselves in order to reach the pinnacle of their sport.

It is incredibly exciting that the NT has swimmers and coaches that are being offered these opportunities in both able-bodied and para swimming and it is great for the sport in the years ahead.

Finally, as part of our commitment to swimmer development, we have worked rigorously with the Northern Territory Sports Academy to reach a great standard of service to assist our high performance swimmers throughout the season. The consultation, feedback and collaboration between the NTSA and SNT has been great to be part of and hopefully, with the restructuring of the NTSA Futures program, NT swimmers will have an enormous amount of opportunity to develop and reach their full potential within the NT. A massive thank you to Tim Ellison, Jodie Zanini and Tadek Rudz for their ongoing support.

Coach Development & Training:

SCTA Courses

At the completion of last year's Country Swimming Championships SNT, in conjunction with Swim Coaches and Teachers Association was run at Parap Pool and had a total of 3 participants. Greg from Katherine, Gabrielle from Nightcliff and an interstate participant. All three successfully passed the course and hopefully will have a successful time coaching kids to improve their swimming and develop a love of swimming.

Additional Training

Other development activities that occurred throughout the year included the phenomenal opportunity for Darwin Head Coach to head to the Australian Institute of Sport (AIS) on 2 occasions, firstly in November to participate in the combined NSW and Victoria Flippers program that was being run. This was in addition to Tim being invited to the Swimming Australia NextGen camp, also in the AIS, to assist with the up and coming development of NextGen athletes, specifically in the area of Backstroke – to coincide with the attendance of Macey Sheridan.



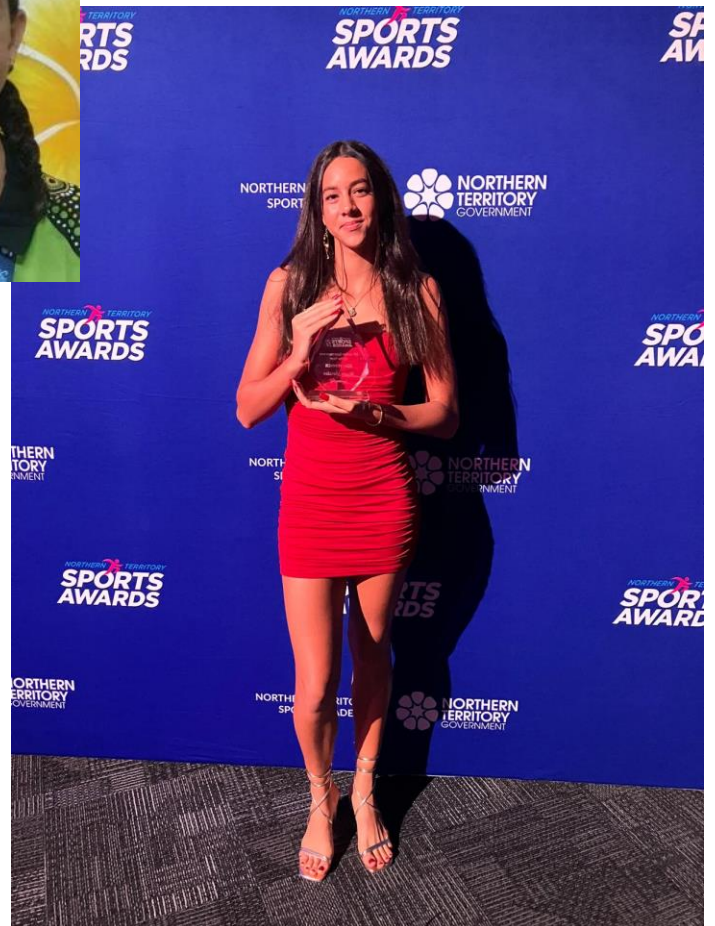

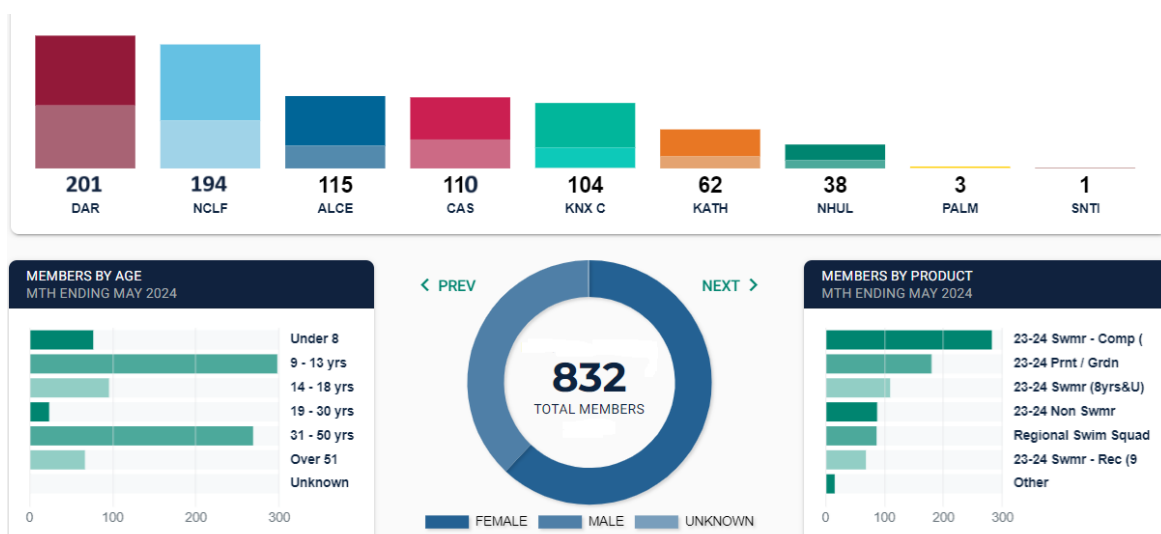

The remainder of the swimmers listed as members comprised of individuals entered into the SNT Open Water events throughout the season, but no other events, as well as a membership for Kate Reynolds as the Technical Manager of SNT. In total, that represents a fantastic 832 members for the 2023-24 season, a 27.8% increase from the previous season and the highest numbers at least for the last 6 years. The 546 swimmers also represented an increase of 32.2% on last year and again, was one of the highest number every recorded for SNT. This is very promising for the future, however, pool closures in both Katherine and Kununurra will dramatically affect membership numbers in the 2024-25 season, however, with the pool now reopened at the SWELL complex in Palmerston, we are confident of a resurgence of swimming at the Palmerston & Rural Swimming Club.

With Darwin Swimming Club taking out all major awards with Chloe, Bronte & McKenzie winning Junior Female, Louis winning Junior Male, Macey, Sienna and Melissa winning Senior Female, Liam and Sampson winning Senior Male, Macey winning Swimmer of the Meet & also walking away with the Champion Club.

The Open Water Championships were no different with Darwin Swimming Club winning multiple events including: 400m – Louis, 2.5km – Liam and Valerie, 5km – James and Sienna and lastly in the 10km – Bayleigh and Chloe.

We had very strong representation at 2023 Australian School Sports with 14 swimmers from Darwin Swimming Club selected to compete. Well done, Khaden, Zayne, Jackson, Noa, Skyler, Taylia, Ella, Liam, Harrison, Alex, Emme, McKenzie, Louis, Oliver. The team had a great experience coming home with countless personal achievements and Oliver, Louis and McKenzie coming home with bronze medals from relay events.



Sienna and Tamsyn were our sole representatives at the 2023 Australia Short Course Championships with Sienna taking home a bronze in the women's 50m breaststroke.



September school holidays ended on a high with the 2023 Country Championships. This was a fantastic opportunity for our swimmers to match themselves against some of the best regional swimmers from around the country. We clocked a 59% PB Rate., 74 gold medals, 34 silver medals, 26 bronze medals, 34 club records, 23 NT records and 20 NT Allcomers records were achieved over the four days of competition.

In December 2023 we had our largest ever interstate travelling team representing Darwin Swimming Club at the 2023 Queensland Championships. Our swimmers competing with the states finest and taking the challenge head on. The experience was amazing and one that holds many memories. The team had seven swimmers make finals, resulting in 4 gold, 3 silver, 2 bronze medals

Our presence at the Swimming NT 2024 State Championships was hard to miss. Once again, our club was named Champion Club with our swimmers winning multiple individual awards including 11 out of 16 Age Champions. Macey Sheridan won the Jim Gayton Trophy, Champion Distance Female and the Swimmer of the Meet. James Smith won Champion Distance Male. Darwin Swimming Club also won the Keith Gabel Trophy, Club Relay and NT Championships Club Trophy.



Our club also had its largest team ever representing Darwin Swim Club at the 2024 Australian Age Championships. 10 talented swimmers, Ella, Macey, Skyler, Chloe, Liam, Sam, Patrick, Bayleigh, Sampson and James making the journey to the Gold Coast. This was absolutely amazing achievement for these young swimmers doing their finest competing with Australia's best of the best. Darwin Swimming Club, for the first time ever, was able to fill 6 relay teams! Stand out performances included Macy who won 5 gold and 1 silver, James winning a bronze and making 3 finals and Bayliegh and Liam for making finals.





We made our club debut at the Masters National Championships in Darwin which saw our small team of seven, Khaden, Dylan, Oscar, Tim, Pippa, Brett and Moira do a fabulous job walking away with 6 gold, 10 silver and 8 bronze as well as a handful of state records.

Lastly, James Smith and Macey Sheridan excelled in the water at the 2024 Olympic Trails in June 2024, this well earned opportunity will no doubt be a steppingstone for both James and Macey for their future swimming careers.

To top this year off our incredible swimmers earned themselves a nomination for Team of the Year and Macey Sheridan being nominated for Junior Sports Person of the Year with 2023 NT Sports Awards. Our team nomination was unsuccessful however Macy Sheridan took out the top honours for her amazing swimming results in 2023.

In between the busy championship events, Darwin Swim club managed to host two wonderful events, the Top End Sprints and the Darwin Super Sprint meet. These events are super fun and allow our club to raise money to assist the growth of our club. We look forward to these events as they give all swimmers the opportunity to develop their skills.

Nightcliff Swimming Club

The Nightcliff Swimming Club (NSC) has experienced a productive and successful 2023/2024 season, highlighted by increased membership, strong competition performances, and growth in coaching capacity. This report provides an overview of the club’s progress and key achievements over the past 12 months.

Membership Growth

The NSC membership base has seen significant growth, from low to mid 100's at the beginning of the 23/24 swim season, to over 200 members (110+ competitive swimmers) in June 2024. The steady growth in membership throughout the year fosters a strong foundation for both recreational and competitive swimming across a large age group.



Coaching & Development

Under the leadership of Head Coach Jane Davies, the club has developed a robust coaching structure with the inclusion of several coaching assistants.

These include, but are not limited to, Sasini Perera, Annabelle West, Nick Koulakis, and Vida Goodvach who provided consistent support during training sessions.

The club has also introduced dryland training, which has been well-received and is particularly popular among junior swimmers. Key coaching initiatives include:

- ✓ Dryland and pool training on Monday, and Wednesday sessions
- ✓ Senior swimmers assisting with junior training groups
- ✓ Continued professional development for the coaching staff, with a focus on future planning
- ✓ Commencement of a regular Sunday training at Parap Pool to enable swimmers to focus on their starts and become accustomed to swimming in the main competition pool in Darwin



Competitive Success

- 1 NT Championships:** NSC saw strong performances with Age Champion awards at for both the male and female 10-year-old categories (Louis Lamont and Gabrielle Hook) and the female 11-year-old category (Tara Samjowan), as well as the female 17&O category (Sasini Perera).
- 2 Australian Age Championships:** NSC was proudly represented by Multiclass swimmers Sean Deutsch, Sahrah Hancock, and Aiko Buckland on the Gold Coast, all of whom achieved PB's, finals placements, and medals, with NSC placing 28th of 109 clubs based on swimmer points
- 3 Lake Argyle Open Water:** NSC had significant participation in WA, showcasing our strength across different swimming disciplines. The team of Sasini Perera, Stella Kiranou, Nicholas Koulakis, and Tahlia Freijah came third overall in the 20km quad event
- 4 Masters Nationals:** NSC was represented by 5 swimmers, with both Abigail West winning 3 gold medals and obtaining NT records in the 18 - 24 age group, as well as Cameron McInerney in the 50 - 55 age group, with NSC placing 39th of 88 clubs based on swimmer points
- 5 Consistent Improvement:** NSC achieved a 70%+ personal best (PB) rate at the pre-Christmas meet, and swimmers have consistently performed well at sprint meets and other local competitions since, maintaining a high PB%

One of the most exciting developments this year has been the introduction of our Masters Swimming Club. This initiative has allowed senior swimmers to continue training and competing beyond their youth years, with Annabelle West, Candice Carpenter, James Carpenter, Beck Lamont, and Cameron McInerney competing at the MSA Nationals Championships in May. This program has added a new dimension to the club and opened opportunities for long-term involvement.

Note 1. Material accounting policy information

The accounting policies that are material to the incorporated association are set out below. The accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous financial year, unless otherwise stated.

New or amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations adopted

The incorporated association has adopted all of the new or amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') that are mandatory for the current reporting period.

Any new or amended Accounting Standards or Interpretations that are not yet mandatory have not been early adopted.

Basis of preparation

In the Committee Members' opinion, the incorporated association is not a reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements.

These are special purpose financial statements that have been prepared for the purposes of complying with the Northern Territory legislation Associations Act 2003 and associated regulations. The Committee Members have determined that the accounting policies adopted are appropriate to meet the needs of the members of Swimming Northern Territory Incorporated.

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements specified by the Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 'Presentation of Financial Statements', AASB 107 'Statement of Cash Flows', AASB 108 'Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors', AASB 1048 'Interpretation of Standards' and AASB 1054 'Australian Additional Disclosures', as appropriate for not-for profit oriented entities.

Critical accounting estimates

The preparation of the financial statements requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise its judgement in the process of applying the incorporated association's accounting policies. The areas involving a higher degree of judgement or complexity, or areas where assumptions and estimates are significant to the financial statements, are disclosed in note 2.

Revenue recognition

The incorporated association recognises revenue as follows:

Revenue from contracts with customers

Revenue is recognised at an amount that reflects the consideration to which the incorporated association is expected to be entitled in exchange for transferring goods or services to a customer. For each contract with a customer, the incorporated association: identifies the contract with a customer; identifies the performance obligations in the contract; determines the transaction price which takes into account estimates of variable consideration and the time value of money; allocates the transaction price to the separate performance obligations on the basis of the relative stand-alone selling price of each distinct good or service to be delivered; and recognises revenue when or as each performance obligation is satisfied in a manner that depicts the transfer to the customer of the goods or services promised.

Variable consideration within the transaction price, if any, reflects concessions provided to the customer such as discounts, rebates and refunds, any potential bonuses receivable from the customer and any other contingent events. Such estimates are determined using either the 'expected value' or 'most likely amount' method. The measurement of variable consideration is subject to a constraining principle whereby revenue will only be recognised to the extent that it is highly probable that a significant reversal in the amount of cumulative revenue recognised will not occur. The measurement constraint continues until the uncertainty associated with the variable consideration is subsequently resolved. Amounts received that are subject to the constraining principle are recognised as a refund liability.

Note 1. Material accounting policy information (continued)

Grants

Grant revenue is recognised in line with AASB 15 and AASB 1058. Revenue from grant recognised when the performance obligations are met and can be measured reliably in profit or loss.

If conditions are attached to the grant which must be satisfied before the Corporation is eligible to retain the contribution, the grant will be recognised in the statement of financial position as a liability until those conditions are satisfied.

Sales revenue

Events, fundraising and raffles are recognised when received or receivable.

Donations and sponsorship

Donations and sponsorship income is recognised at the time the pledge is made.

Interest

Interest revenue is recognised as interest accrues using the effective interest method. This is a method of calculating the amortised cost of a financial asset and allocating the interest income over the relevant period using the effective interest rate.

Other revenue

Other revenue is recognised when it is received or when the right to receive payment is established.

Income tax

As the incorporated association is a tax exempt institution in terms of subsection 50-10 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997, as amended, it is exempt from paying income tax.

Property, plant and equipment

Plant and equipment is stated at historical cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment. Historical cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the items.

Depreciation is calculated on a straight-line basis to write off the net cost of each item of property, plant and equipment over their expected useful lives as follows:

Buildings	25 years
Motor Vehicles	3-4 years
Plant and equipment	3-8 years

The residual values, useful lives and depreciation methods are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at each reporting date.

An item of property, plant and equipment is derecognised upon disposal or when there is no future economic benefit to the incorporated association. Gains and losses between the carrying amount and the disposal proceeds are taken to profit or loss.

Trade and other payables

These amounts represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the incorporated association prior to the end of the financial year and which are unpaid. Due to their short-term nature they are measured at amortised cost and are not discounted. The amounts are unsecured and are usually paid within 30 days of recognition.

Goods and Services Tax ('GST') and other similar taxes

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of associated GST, unless the GST incurred is not recoverable from the tax authority. In this case it is recognised as part of the cost of the acquisition of the asset or as part of the expense.

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the tax authority is included in other receivables or other payables in the statement of financial position.

New Accounting Standards and Interpretations not yet mandatory or early adopted

Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations that have recently been issued or amended but are not yet mandatory, have not been early adopted by the incorporated association for the annual reporting period ended 30 June 2024. The incorporated association has not yet assessed the impact of these new or amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations.

Note 2. Critical accounting judgements, estimates and assumptions

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts in the financial statements. Management continually evaluates its judgements and estimates in relation to assets, liabilities, contingent liabilities, revenue and expenses. Management bases its judgements, estimates and assumptions on historical experience and on other various factors, including expectations of future events, that management believes to be reasonable under the circumstances. The resulting accounting judgements and estimates will seldom equal the related actual results. The judgements, estimates and assumptions that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities (refer to the respective notes) within the next financial year are discussed below.

Estimation of useful lives of assets

The incorporated association determines the estimated useful lives and related depreciation and amortisation charges for its property, plant and equipment and finite life intangible assets. The useful lives could change significantly as a result of technical innovations or some other event. The depreciation and amortisation charge will increase where the useful lives are less than previously estimated lives, or technically obsolete or non-strategic assets that have been abandoned or sold will be written off or written down.
