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INDEPENDENT PRESIDENTS REPORT

It has been another great year for swimming in the Northern Territory. As you all know our past President – Garry Lambert – finished his time with us at the last AGM. Since then, we were privileged to have Emily Knott step into the role for a short period before family commitments and a move away from the NT limited her ability to fill the position. Since December 2022 I have been honoured to be the acting President while the Board continued to source an Independent President. We were pleased to announce this was filled in August this year, with Tamara Keane agreeing to take on this great opportunity. I know the Board are looking forward to working with, and supporting, Tamara as she grows in the role.

I have been involved with swimming for around 10 years through supporting my kids in the sport. This has involved being a member of our local swimming club committee to now being a Board Member of SNTI. Throughout this time, I have seen many swimmers push themselves to continue gaining personal bests and achieving their goals in the sport. While there have been a few challenges on the way I believe we have achieved a lot of good things this time as well. Swimming in the NT is hosted in a modern facility in Parap but over the coming year or so, two new pools will come online. Times are exciting for Swimming as we have a great opportunity to grow our club's membership base with these new facilities becoming available in Casuarina and Palmerston.



It was with great pleasure that we welcomed a new Executive Officer to the team in early 2023, Warren Dopson has stepped into his role and achieved some great successes in a very short time. This includes the grants that became available to host the 2023 Australia Country Championships in Darwin again. This event, as well as the one successfully held last year, was a great success and I believe the momentum we have gained from hosting this again will mean we can continue to grow the sport in the NT. The feedback we got was amazing, with many swimmers and

supporters letting us know how much they enjoyed the event. But events like this don't just materialise, it was through the hard work of the two SNTI staff members, Warren and Jane Edwards, plus the many volunteers, such as the swimmers who helped set-up and then pack-up to the Technical Officials – both local and domestic who made this event even possible. So, a great thanks to all that helped make this event such a success, without your help this event would not have been the success it was.

The other significant appointment made during the year was having Kate Reynolds take on the Technical Manager role for SNTI. Kate has hit the ground running as well and provided great support to all the experienced and up-and-coming technical officials in the NT. It was then later in the year that we announced that Kate is now a member of the Technical Swimming Committee for Swimming Australia.

In closing, the 2022-2023 period has been one of great opportunities for the sport, even if during this time there was significant changes in the make-up of SNTI with three Presidents and two EO's. I believe we are in a great position to grow the sport moving forward and to continue to build great relationships with both our external stakeholders (like other State bodies and Swimming Australia) and out internal members (such as the clubs and their members). CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER REPORT

I am happy to present the 2022-23 Swimming Northern Territory Annual Report, my first of hopefully many reports as the Chief Executive Officer of Swimming Northern Territory.

Looking back 12 months I can honestly say that I certainly had no expectations that I would currently be in this role, however, I can proudly say that I am thrilled to have been given the opportunity. When I began, I was the fifth CEO in the previous 15 months and while this turnover is unfortunate, I would like to thank my predecessors, Rob, Lee-Ann, Tom and Ravin for the work they have done with Swimming Northern Territory and each of the legacies you have created in your time here.

My focus is to work with the Board of Swimming Northern Territory to grow the sport throughout the Territory and provide support to our key participants in the sport, while enhancing the commercial and financial success of the organisation. Though, for me, I am most passionate about development and providing unique and incredible opportunities to swimmers, coaches and technical officials that will enrich their time in the sport and enable experiences that will benefit and bring joy to them throughout their life. These people give up so much time and put in enormous efforts to participate in, train and manage swimming that it is my duty to ensure that they are provided with the best levels of support, encouragement, and opportunity to succeed, in their own way.

There have been troubled times recently with Swimming Northern Territory with an unusually high and quick turnover of Board Presidents and CEO's, however the current team are committed to putting the work in to provide clear and attainable pathways forward for all of our key participants. Sport in Australia presently has great prospects, with the upcoming Olympics in Brisbane in 2032, to build a framework that will bring success in the short-term, while providing that foundation that will enable long-term viability and sustainability, especially for swimming, the most popular Olympic sport. My aim is to utilise this once in a generation opportunity to raise the awareness of swimming and its incredible health and social benefits to the wider Northern Territory community. Additionally, I want to increase the standard here, not only of management of the sport, but also of the belief of our active participants, to empower our swimmers, coaches and technical officials with the confidence that they can work with and compete with the best in the nation when it counts.

Membership

The first step in this journey is through participation. This season, we have a slight drop in numbers from 696 members to 634 members, including a fall in competitive swimmers from 425 down to 351. There are a number of factors that have contributed to these lower numbers, from the effects of a COVID hangover and the tendency of sports to increase activities over the immediate period to compensate for the lost time, the increasing cost of living pressures facing Territory families, the closure and refurbishment of both Casuarina and Palmerston pools at the same time, as well as the uncertainty surrounding the management

of SNT. However, the prospect of future growth are looking promising. Both Casuarina and Palmerston pools are to be reopen shortly and with it comes much needed lane space and certainty for swimmers. Additionally, SNT will be looking to improve program delivery, especially in schools to provide kids with the pathway into a swimming club and onto the world of competitive swimming.

Partners & Sponsors

As the peak sporting body for swimming in the Northern Territory, we are responsible for the ongoing success of the sport. We would be unable to do this without the incredible support we receive from all of our partners and sponsors.



The biggest financial supporter of Swimming Northern Territory is the Northern Territory Government. This year, apart from numerous opportunities in governance, management and other sports related programs, the NTG has significantly assisted SNT financially, through our Peak Sporting Body Funding, through the NT Sports Academy support of our technical officials, the Health department support of our All-Abilities program, as well as, of course the funding from the NT Major Events Company to enable the inaugural Country Swimming Championships in October. The NT Government is vitally important to Swimming here in the Northern Territory and we thank them enormously.

The Australian Federal Government continued to support SNT through the continued funding of the Social Inclusion and Physical Activity program (eNtry) throughout the entire Territory. This program has been running for several years and enabled SNT to provide swimming sessions, teaching fundamental skills throughout 8 identified Indigenous community hubs. This year was the final year of funding for this project, that has created wonderful experiences for participants across the Territory.

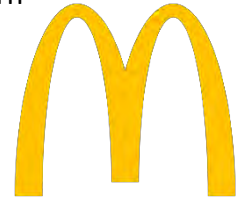

The City of Darwin is also a fantastic contributor to Swimming Northern Territory through the provision of aquatic facilities, such as Parap and Nightcliff pools, as well as the rebuilding of Casuarina pool. In addition to this, the City of Darwin was the major sponsor of the 2023 City of Darwin NT Open and Age Championships, held in March. In addition to their financial support of this event, the City of Darwin also provided enormous in-kind support, waiving pool hire fees. Thank you to the City of Darwin.

McDonald's has been a long-time supporter of Swimming Northern Territory and they again provided both financial and in-kind support to the organisation. This sponsorship has been in existence for over 10 years and enables SNT to run our Come and Try Meets, as well as providing many benefits to our swimmers and families via free food vouchers. A new addition to the sponsor list this year was Darwin Corporate Park. This sponsorship enabled Swimming Northern Territory to have a modern office in which to work from throughout the year, with thanks to Ruwan Perera for facilitating the agreement.

Additionally, we welcomed Team Elite as a first-year sponsor. Team Elite provided financial support to Swimming Northern Territory this year. In addition, we have utilised their expertise to provide incredible medals to the swimmers, as well as wonderful merchandise that has been very quickly snapped up and appreciated by our swimmers and their families. The commitment Team Elite has shown over the year to SNT has been fantastic and we hope that this is a long-lasting partnership.



Finances

The audited financial statements for the 2022-23 financial year are at the back of this annual report, however, it was pleasing to note that we have again recorded a small surplus of \$12,877. This is very pleasing given the non-cash write off of the old Casuarina booth and the extraordinary legal expenses this year that took over \$28k off the bottom line, resulting in a \$40.9k operating surplus. Swimming Northern Territory has done a fantastic job in recovering from some financial difficulties previously and the current financial position stands SNT in good stead for the years to come.

Unfortunately, the funding outlook into the future is looking challenging. There is currently a reduction across all sports in terms of Government funding, while sponsorship is becoming harder to entice. In addition to this, there have been significant funding reductions from Swimming Australia. As such, SNT need to be prudent about expenditures moving forward, without decreasing the provision of services to our key stakeholders. SNT will be looking to increasing our exposure in the community and partnering with firms that fit our stakeholders, in addition to that, we have and will continue to look for tangible and manageable cost savings in the entity.

Activities

What we are all here for is swimming, and this year there has been some wonderful achievements. The following pages will go into more detail around this year's events and programs, but I would like to acknowledge the work done by Eduard Ferrer, the SNT Participation and Pathways Manager in taking over the management of the eNTRY program and running fantastic clinics, events and fun activities in Alice Springs, Borroloola, Tennent Creek, Nhulunbuy (twice), Jabiru and with the Bagot Community, here in Darwin. In addition to that project, Ed also did a great job with the All-Abilities program, which was aimed at getting swimmers with a disability, at ALL levels into the water to experience the wonderful benefits swimming has to offer.



In addition to these, we also ran a clinic in April with the High-Performance team from Southport Olympic at Parap, while shortly after the swimmers of Casuarina and Darwin experienced swimming with the team from SASI, including Olympic and World Champion, Kyle Chalmers. SNT also ran a McDonald's Come and Try meet at Nightcliff in February, attracting over 30 swimmers. On top of this we held our Short Course Championships, Open Water Championships and NT Open and Age Championships, however, the highlight was the inaugural Country Swimming Championships that, after many years of hard work from previous SNT Management teams, finally came to fruition with around 370 swimmers from across regional Australia converging on Darwin to compete in this fantastic event. Congratulations to Rob and Jane for managing the event, with Ravin, Lee-Ann and Tom laid the all-important groundwork that we are benefiting from today. It was an enormous undertaking, but the swimmers, technical officials, and coaches and their families from across the country had a great time, creating many wonderful memories and some incredible swimming, with a huge amount of NT and NT all-comer records being re-written.



The pinnacle of our sport in this country is our National Championships. This year we had 7 swimmers from Darwin compete at the Australian Age Championships and 2 swimmers from Darwin compete in the Australian Open Championships, both on the Gold Coast and a further 3 swimmers from Darwin compete at the World Championship Trials in Melbourne. Each of these swimmers (Patrick Brown, Sampson Gee, Chloe Reader, Melissa Roberts, Macey Sheridan, James Smith, Bayleigh Young, Sienna Walo and Tamsyn Walo) did an incredible job with James, Bayleigh and Tamsyn all making finals or producing top 10 finishers. Sienna Walo won a bronze in the 50m Breaststroke, while the absolute standout performance at the meet was Macey Sheridan who recorded an incredible 6 Gold medals, with an

additional 2 finals, a feat rarely seen at any Australian Age Championships since their inception. It was an unbelievable effort by Macey, which catapulted her into Australian Swimming history.

Well done to all the swimmers and coaches in all of the events attended throughout the NT and across Australia throughout the year.

Volunteers

I would like to sincerely thank each and every person that has assisted SNT operate this year for all that you have done in giving up your time and/or expertise to make this sport as great as it is. Your involvement is fundamental to the success of this great sport. So, from the timekeepers to the medal presenters to the announcers and everyone in between – THANK YOU.

Additionally, I must acknowledge and pay tribute to our wonderful Technical Officials. This year, SNT was most fortunate to have Katherine Reynolds step into the Technical Manager role and has transformed the culture and knowledge within the entire team. Kate has vast experience and is a current World Aquatics Open Water Referee who has officiated at many state and national meets and brings this experience to our dedicated, highly competent and fun-loving team. Technical officials aim to make the sport fair for all and without them, our sport wouldn't be possible. Thank you.



Finally, to the entire Board of Swimming Northern Territory, I would like to express my gratitude for providing me this opportunity to transform swimming in the Northern Territory and give all participants the opportunity to make the most of their time in our sport. The whole board has been incredibly welcoming and willing to work with me, implementing new ideas and suggestions to improve swimming throughout the NT. Thank you to the Acting President, Mark Edwards, who has always been a great sounding board and provider of local knowledge. Also, a special thank you to Melanie Lei for her guidance and knowledge that she has provided. Melanie is stepping off the board this year and her experience, enthusiasm and understanding of swimming in the NT will be sorely missed.

Swimming is an incredible sport with incredible lifelong health and social benefits, however, as a sport, it can be demanding and unforgiving, yet incredibly rewarding. I want to dedicate my time in this role to providing the best experiences and the greatest opportunities to our swimmers, coaches and technical officials that will harness a lifelong love of swimming. There is a long and winding road ahead, but I hope it is a journey that I can make worthwhile and enjoyable for everyone involved in this great sport.

Swimming NT Sub Committees

The following Sub Committees were developed during the 2022/2023 Season.

Unfortunately, due to the high turnover of staff, there were no committees formed this season. Swimming Northern Territory relies on volunteers for these committees to help spread the workload and we request assistance in the below areas moving forward. These committees are vital in the formation, development, planning, management and execution of programs aimed at developing unique and incredible opportunities and experiences for our swimmers, coaches and technical officials, so they can compete equally well, if not better than anybody else in Australia. We have a fantastic group of people involved in the sport in the NT and we would really like to see them be at the pinnacle of this sport while they are here in the Northern Territory, providing a clear pathway to those that follow.

Athlete and Coach Development Sub-Committee:

The Athlete and Coach Development Committee shall consist of three to five (3-5) members who represent a range of expertise in coaching, officiating, governance and sport/athlete development. The committee shall include at least one (1) senior coach.

53.3 The Athlete and Coach Development Committee along with other sub-committees and the Board, generate and review policies related to athlete development pathways (including team/squad selection) and coach development pathways (including selection)

Technical Sub-Committee:

The Technical Committee shall consist of three to five (3-5) members who represent a range of technical, training and governance skills and experience. The Technical Committee shall include at least one (1) Referee and at least one (1) (Technical assessor), where possible.

The Technical Committee may set and review SNTI's policy(s) regarding pathways for technical officials for ratification by the Board.

Selection Sub-Committee:

Selection Committee shall consist of three to five (3-5) members who represent a range of expertise in coaching, officiating, governance and sport/athlete development. The committee shall include at least one (1) coach and at least one (1) technical official.

The Selection Committee will be responsible for the approval/selection of appointment for all positions to teams and committees according to the relevant policy and shall provide selection results according to the relevant policy.

Competitions Sub-Committee:

The Competition Committee shall consist of three to five (3-5) members who represent a range of expertise in coaching, officiating, and sport/athlete development. The committee shall include at least one (1) coach and at least one (1) technical official.

The competition sub-committee will, with the Technical Committee, review and provide updates to SNTI Policies regarding swim meet classification standards to be ratified by the Board.

TECHNICAL MANAGER REPORT

It has been a good year for Technical Officiating in the Northern Territory (NT). The year began with planning for the inaugural 2022 Country Championships, with the aim that this National meet should be an opportunity for mentorship and development of the SNT Officiating program. Sarah Emery (QLD) and Kaye Bolger (WA) were invited to run a workshop prior to the event focused on the rules and pool deck protocols. There were several experienced officials who also nominated for the event and willingly gave of their time and knowledge to mentor the SNT team. It was an enormous success. Development Day ran Friday afternoon and was attended by 14 officials of which 9 were SNT Officials. The following 4 days of competition saw SNT officials gaining experience both on pool deck and in the control room where they were able to draw on the experience around them. Open Water Series and Championships

Three Open Water events were held at the Darwin Waterfront including the 2022 State Championships. SNT has seen the number of officials supporting Open Water events increase by 100%. Last year SNT was able to hold the championships event due to the support of visiting official Sue Worthington (NSW), however this year has seen the addition of 3 new officials who volunteer to officiate at the events. SNT and Masters Swimming NT held a combined event which was run by the Technical Manager from SNT. All events have enjoyed positive feedback, particularly in the conduction of the competition. Officiating has also formalised procedures to ensure swimmer safety and consistent application of the rules. Thank you to Jane Edwards, Kathleen Rochford, Adam Walo, Howie Young and Tanya Roberts for all your officiating support.



SNT Officiating supported 12 SNT sanctioned events including the State Long Course and State Short Course Championships. We are proud of the fact that we have been able to meet the minimum requirements of 6 officials to support the competition for all events. The median number of officials volunteering for events are 7. The Technical Manager was more often that not able to work with less experienced officials to support growth and development in their roles. The Technical Manager has ensured that every advantage is taken at any event to educate and support the development of all officials so that a professional and collegial environment is fostered. Officials have been invited to attend three Swimming Australia and one Swimming WA webinars covering topics such rule changes and soft skills of officiating. Over the course of 2022/2023 SNT Officiating has achieved the following results.

In February 2023, Kathleen Rochford and Kate Reynolds travelled to Alice Springs to support officiating at ASSC 2022 Desert Qualifier. A seminar introducing the principles of Officiating was held. 6 people from the club attended (4 new and 2 current). The event was then utilised to consolidate the learnings of Starting and Refereeing basic principles. The aim of this opportunity was to ensure that ASSC would have additional officiating support to run club nights. Jenny Culgan visited the club 6 weeks later to provide additional opportunities for these new volunteers to develop their roles.



Swimming NT Officiating has been represented at national events throughout the year with the following appointments:

Kate Reynolds also attended the World Aquatics Open Water Certification School in June to renew her accreditation as a World Aquatics Open Water Referee. She passed the required examinations and looks forward to re-nominating for List 16 next year.

In summary, the future of SNT Officiating is looking very bright. We are looking to recruit more officials this year and hoping to see more representation on the national stage. SNT would like to thank very much, all our Technical Officials for volunteering their time to:

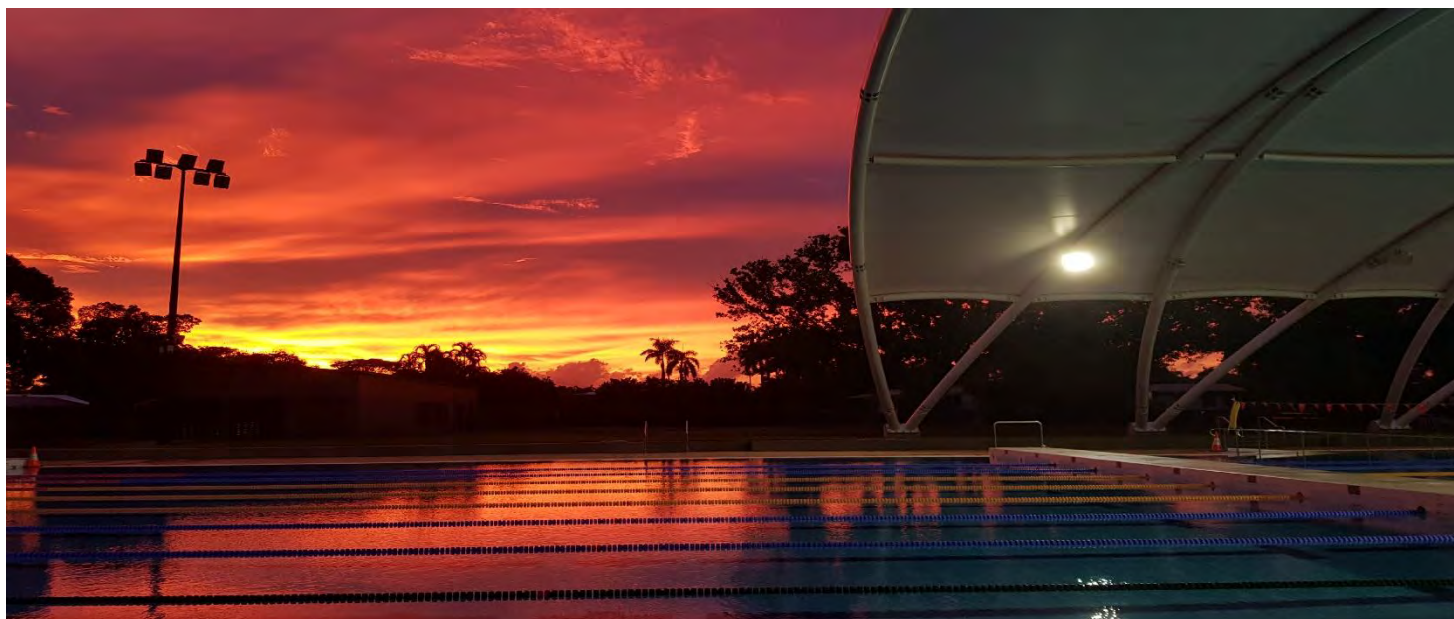

2022 Country Swimming Championships



The inaugural 2022 Country Swimming Championships was held in Darwin at the Parap Pool from 1st – 4th October 2022 and what an event it was. The underlying premise of the event was to attract swimmers from regional and remote areas around Australia to participate in a Championship meet in order to provide valuable experiences in their swimming journey that, previously had not been available. The event was aimed at those swimmers at a level that made it difficult for them from the Swimming Australia Australian Age Championships, the top tier of swimming, anywhere in the world.



Historically, these regional-based swimmers, are often overlooked when providing relevant pathway performance events undertaken by Swimming Australia and other state-based peak sporting bodies, largely due to them not having the same access to adequate facilities, access to full-time, highly developed coaches or are provided the same opportunities, through the tyranny of distance that capital city swimmers are afforded.

Working to increase opportunity and inclusion, whilst providing incredible life-long experiences to this group of swimmers, Swimming Northern Territory devised the Country Championships. An Australia-wide quality swimming Championship event that was available to those regional and remote swimmers that work hard, love the sport, but generally don't get to compete on a national stage. Not only was it a great chance to provide these swimmers that experience, but it was also a chance to be a great showcase for the Northern Territory and all of the incredible destinations and attractions that make this often-overlooked part of Australia so wonderful and breathtaking.

Operationally, Swimming Northern Territory is a very small team, however, we were able to attract 348 swimmers (incl. 267 from interstate) from 67 clubs from each state within Australia, except Tasmania. In addition, this the event drew over 30 coaches, 22 Technical officials and a further 420-450 individual spectators that visited the venue multiple times over the 4-day event, as well as the day prior. A total of 164 different events were conducted, consisting of 502 heats, with a total of 3,899 individual swims over the 4 days culminating in the awarding of 492 medals. Overall, the event was a huge success, which highlighted the ability of the NT swimming community to come together and conduct an incredibly successful national event. There was a huge amount of pb's, as well as NT and NT allcomers records.



Events like this don't come together by themselves, so there is a debt of gratitude to those at the forefront of the organisation, including Jane Edwards, who undertook a massive role in getting this event running and without her efforts, it simply wouldn't have happened. Additionally, to Rob West, CEO of SNT at the time, as well as former CEO's Ravin, Lee-Ann and Tom for working tirelessly over many years to get this Championship event to fruition. Also, to all of the additional helpers, the timekeepers, the numerous technical officials, from the NT and interstate, to the Board members of SNT who assisted throughout the meet, the announcers and all others, thank you for your efforts to make this event happen and, hopefully, become a permanent must-attend meet on the Australian Swimming calendar.

2023 National Championships

Congratulations also go to Bayleigh Young who qualified for his first ever National Final in the 200m Butterfly – great work.

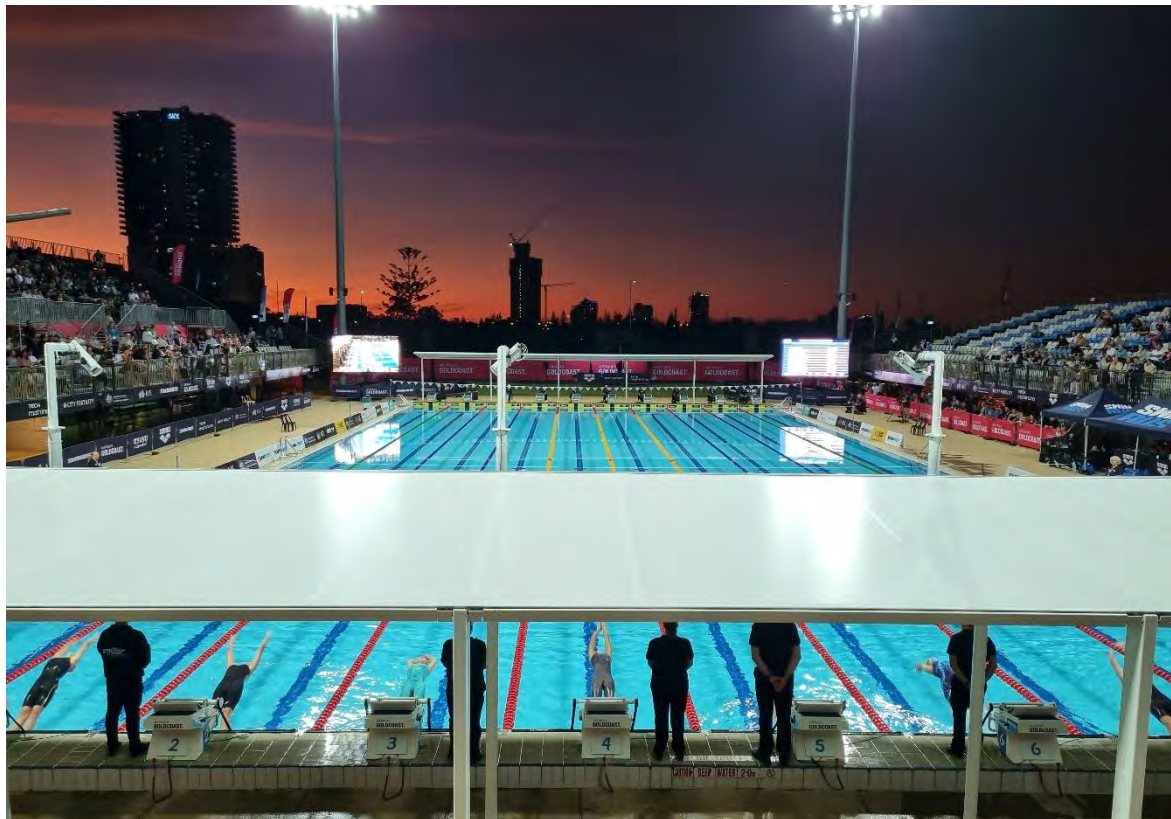

Athlete Development

Swimming Northern Territory prides itself on the commitment to swimmer, coach and technical official development. However, this year was somewhat of a disappointing year for SNT in this area, with not many activities being undertaken and athlete development being left to the clubs.

In saying that, there is a renewed push to make up for this shortcoming throughout the second half of the season, with a plan to implement a structured development program that will assist swimmers, coaches and technical officials.

Whilst the development of this was underway, a junior clinic with the High-Performance team from Southport Olympic on the Gold Coast was achieved in late April.



This clinic saw 42 swimmers, many from the Darwin area rotate through different skills sessions in the pool, after a talk from 2 Australian Team Coaches (Glenn Baker and Sean Eels). The session was rounded off with some giveaways and autographs. A fun morning for all.

In addition to this, as part of the eNtry program, former Participation and Pathway Manager did run some development sessions with club swimmers in both Alice Springs and Nhulunbuy. Swimmers from both clubs had a great learning experience and hopefully their swimming benefitted from the experience.

Moving forward, there is a renewed focus to enhance the swimming pathway for competitors in the Northern Territory. Current work on a development team structure is underway that will provide a more structured and communicated development plan. In addition to this, there has also been a significant amount of development planning undertaken for the Country Swimming Championships and beyond, including a JX clinic, hosted by Australian Dolphin, Chelsea Hodges, a technical official training day, put together by SNT Technical Manager Kate Reynolds and the opportunity for a development coaching clinic run by Swim Coaches and Teachers Association. In addition to that, SNT are rolling out a Women's Health Initiative to assist female members and their families through their teenage years and beyond with important health advice and knowledge compiled from the Australian Institute of Sport and Territory Sports Medicine.



SNT is determined to offer incredible development opportunities and experiences for our stakeholders, and we look forward to finalizing our plans and kickstarting a great year of development in the 2023-24 season.

Coach Development & Training:

SCTA Courses



Swimming Northern Territory undertook one development coaching course in September 2022, with Rob West that looked to develop 3 development level coaches from regional NT areas.

SNT is looking to work with the Swim Coaches and Teachers Association to provide further development opportunities, not only for people interested in becoming a coach, but also to enhance the skills and knowledge of the NT's existing coaches.

In addition to this, SNT is working with other state organisations to collaborate on coach development, including spending resources to provide great learning outcomes for the Territories coaches. Informal opportunities have existed throughout this season to interaction with Australian coaches from Southport Olympic Glenn Baker and Sean Eels) and the South Australian Sports Institute (Peter Bishop) during their visits to Darwin. Swimming NT will be looking to make the most of these coaching opportunities into the future with structured learning opportunities.

Additional Training

Pool Lifeguard and Lifeguard Update Courses

Swimming Northern Territory has moved away from conducting courses of this nature for the present time to be resources being spent elsewhere and the fact that SNT doesn't control any pool facilities currently, so this is a task for others to manage.

First Aid Training

Social Inclusion

Providing a Culturally Safe Entry Level Program for Swimming in the NT

The Project aim is to

‘Utilise swimming as a vehicle to improve outcomes for indigenous people.’



With the establishment of 8 swim HUBS in Communities in the Northern Territory, Swimming NT, has given a group of disadvantaged Aboriginal youth new opportunities and access to fun/safe water activities. The project aims at increasing participation in sport among indigenous communities in the NT. We promote better health and education outcomes by encouraging community participation, partnerships, and good citizenship. Our partnership with schools, community groups and families have a key role to play in ensuring Indigenous children in NT remote areas continue to engage and participate in our swimming programs.

Swimming NT establishes its programs around the following:

- Increase active participation – Territory wide
- Encourage community ownership
- Increase physical activity through swimming
- Embrace social inclusion and diversity
- Respect culture
- Building partnerships
- Creating social connections
- Building community mentors/ role models
- Promoting healthy lifestyles
- Increasing well-being
- Celebrating and Respecting Indigenous culture



This year has seen the end of the Social Inclusion Program (eNTry), where since his arrival, Ed has taken trips to Tennant Creek, Jabiru, Nhulunbuy (twice), Alice Spring and Borroloola. These have been incredible opportunities for swimmers in these areas to expand their skills, become water safe and have fun, also while raising the profile of swimming in these otherwise remote areas.

All Abilities Initiative

Swimming Northern Territory with support from the NT Government announced the commencement of its 'All-Abilities Swimming Initiative'.

The initiative's aim is to give children in Darwin and Palmerston who have disabilities experience and access into the sport of swimming.

Swimming NTs 'All-Abilities Initiative' originally consisted of a fortnightly Swimming Group which will operate out of the Darwin based pools. Accredited program coaches who are trained to teach swimmers with a disability have taught the program participants the important skills of swimming and promoted fitness. The group also encouraged social knowledge and allows participants to learn at their own pace in an inclusive and supportive environment.

Swimming NT hope that these sessions will provide a steppingstone for those athletes interested in gaining more information, knowledge and becoming more involved in club swimming.

This program was managed by Ed Ferrer, SNT Participation and Pathway Manager, with the assistance of Amanda Bagley from Nightcliff. Ed and Amanda initially started this group small, in February 2023, however managed to grow the single swimmer lessons to around 16 swimmers in a short period of time. The joy these kids got was awesome to see and full acknowledgement must go to Ed and Amanda.

Of course, this program has also allowed established swimmers with a disability to have that one-on-one opportunity to enhance their skills, which led to some great outcomes for Sahrah and Sean.

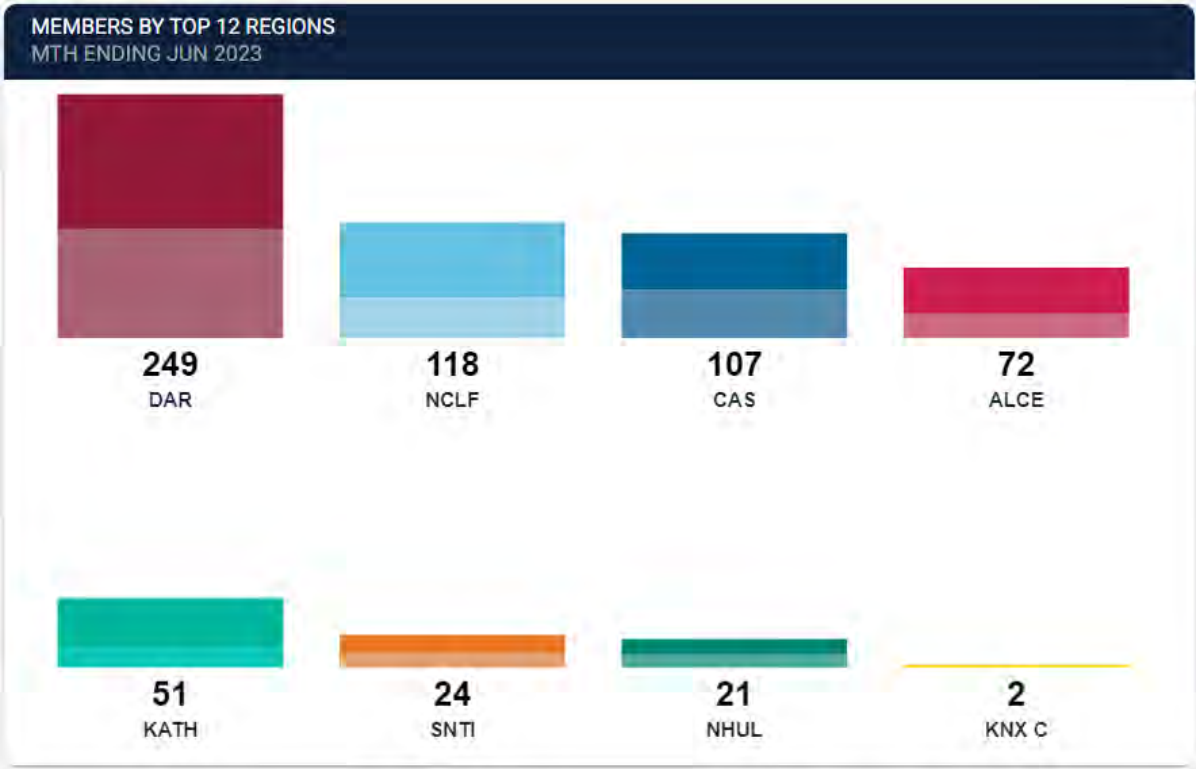
Well done to everyone and we hope to get the program running again shortly.

The season got off to a wonderful start with a team of 13 swimmers (O.Callander, T.Walo, S.Walo, K.Mallett, J.Smith, Z.Mallett, B.Young, T.Sheridan, I.Demasi-Chapman, S.Walo, M.Taylor, M.Sheridan, E.Smith) heading down to Sydney to take part in the 2022 NSW Country Short Course Championships. The team ended with 5 Gold, 5 Silver, 8 Bronze medals as well as multiple club & NT records. The team then headed up to do a week training camp with Mingara Aquatics. This gave them the opportunity to make new friends and learn new skills while having fun. Massive thank you to Mingara Aquatics & Jen Noel for hosting us.

The 2022 SNT Short Course Championships added to the already wonderful start to the season with a massive team effort with tons of PB's, Club & NT records being broken by multiple athletes. The Club managed to win the team point score. We also had wonderful individual achievements with Liam Brown winning Junior Male Champion and Macey Sheridan going back-to-back with her winning the Junior Female Champion and the Swimmer of the Meet.



To round of the short course season, we saw Tamsyn & Sienna representing the club at the Australian Short Course Championships. Both girls did a wonderful job representing the NT, Darwin & themselves against the best in the country. Massive well done to Sienna on securing her first national medal finishing 3rd in the age 50m Breast & 100m IM.

The 2022-2023 Open water had a solid turn out from our older swimmers. This included the NT Championships which saw J.Culgan (10KM), J.Smith (5KM), M.Sheridan (2.5km), D.Mende (2.5km) winning Gold, S.Walo (10KM), T.Few (10km), M.Gallager (5km), E.Cox (2.5km) winning Silver and A.Tully (10km), B.Peacocke (2.5km) winning Bronze. The 2023 Lake Argyle swim which had 13 swimmers attend with the quad team of Sienna, Tamsyn, James & Bayleigh winning the 20km in a record time of 4:16.23. It finished off with the Darwin Ocean swim which saw James & Megan taking out the win in the 2km events. Massive congratulations to James & Megan who also met open national qualifying times.

The long course season started with the Nighcliff invitational and Age championships being awarded to Zeke, Danny, Bailey, Josh, Harry, Sam, Jackson, Bayleigh, Dylan, Isla, Bronte, Macey, Izy & Taylia.



The inaugural Country Championships were an absolute success with a massive showing of 60 swimmers in both the Championships & the Age Challenge. We had over 25 Club, 15 NT & 10 Allcomers records broken by individuals (Macey, Sienna, Tamsyn, James, Bayleigh) & Relay teams.

Katherine invitational was a massive success with the team managing to secure another team points trophy. Well done to everyone who made the trip.

13 swimmers Ella, Macey, Izy, Skyler, Chloe, Tamsyn, Sienna, Liam, Sam, Bayleigh, Patrick, Zayne & James took their skills down to compete at the 2022 QLD State Championships. The team did an amazing job resetting PB's, Club and NT Records along they way. Macey managed to secure 2 Gold, 1 Silver & 2 Bronze medals with Sienna snagging a Silver medal.



The NT Championships rolled around in March with another strong showing from the club which resulted in heaps of PB's, Club, NT & Allcomers records. The team did an amazing job winning the Keith Gabel, Relay & NT Open & Age Championship trophies. We also had Louis, McKenzie, Ella, Sam, Macey, Melissa, Bayleigh, Chloe, Zayne, James & Tamsyn secure age Championship trophies. Lastly we had Sienna winning the Jim Gayton Trophy (50m Free), Ella

winning Champion Female, James Male Distance Champion, Macey Female Distance Champion, Ella Swimmer of the meet.

The 2023 National Championships were an absolute success with a team of 7 attending age Macey, Melissa, Chloe, Sampson, Bayleigh, Patrick & James, & 2 attending open Sienna & Tamsyn. These remarkable athletes took to the water to show the country the talent that the NT has to offer. We had James, Sienna, Tamsyn, Bayleigh & Macey all finish top 10 in the country. Chloe & Sampson secured multiple top 20 finishes & Melissa & Patrick secured top 50 placings. Macey lit up the national stage securing 8 national finals and walking away with 6 Gold medals. Macey also managed to swim multiple top 10 all-time times.

The season ended with Macey, Sienna & Tamsyn heading to Melbourne to compete at the 2023 World Championship Trials. This was the first time in decades that the NT had swimmers at a trials event of this magnitude. Sienna did a wonderful job swimming herself into multiple B Fianls, with Macey (being the youngest competitor) and Tamsyn just missing out on B Finals.

Note 1. Significant accounting policies

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

New or amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations adopted

The incorporated association has adopted all of the new or amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') that are mandatory for the current reporting period.

Any new or amended Accounting Standards or Interpretations that are not yet mandatory have not been early adopted.

Basis of preparation

In the Committee Members' opinion, the incorporated association is not a reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements.

These are special purpose financial statements that have been prepared for the purposes of complying with the Northern Territory legislation Associations Act 2003 and associated regulations. The Committee Members have determined that the accounting policies adopted are appropriate to meet the needs of the members of Swimming Northern Territory Incorporated.

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements specified by the Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 'Presentation of Financial Statements', AASB 107 'Statement of Cash Flows', AASB 108 'Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors', AASB 1048 'Interpretation of Standards' and AASB 1054 'Australian Additional Disclosures', as appropriate for not-for profit oriented entities.

Historical cost convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Critical accounting estimates

The preparation of the financial statements requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise its judgement in the process of applying the incorporated association's accounting policies. The areas involving a higher degree of judgement or complexity, or areas where assumptions and estimates are significant to the financial statements, are disclosed in note 2.

Revenue recognition

The incorporated association recognises revenue as follows:

Revenue from contracts with customers

Revenue is recognised at an amount that reflects the consideration to which the incorporated association is expected to be entitled in exchange for transferring goods or services to a customer. For each contract with a customer, the incorporated association: identifies the contract with a customer; identifies the performance obligations in the contract; determines the transaction price which takes into account estimates of variable consideration and the time value of money; allocates the transaction price to the separate performance obligations on the basis of the relative stand-alone selling price of each distinct good or service to be delivered; and recognises revenue when or as each performance obligation is satisfied in a manner that depicts the transfer to the customer of the goods or services promised.

Variable consideration within the transaction price, if any, reflects concessions provided to the customer such as discounts, rebates and refunds, any potential bonuses receivable from the customer and any other contingent events. Such estimates are determined using either the 'expected value' or 'most likely amount' method. The measurement of variable consideration is subject to a constraining principle whereby revenue will only be recognised to the extent that it is highly probable that a significant reversal in the amount of cumulative revenue recognised will not occur. The measurement constraint continues until the uncertainty associated with the variable consideration is subsequently resolved. Amounts received that are subject to the constraining principle are recognised as a refund liability.

Note 1. Significant accounting policies (continued)

Grants

Grant revenue is recognised in line with AASB 15 and AASB 1058. Revenue from grant recognised when the performance obligations are met and can be measured reliably in profit or loss.

If conditions are attached to the grant which must be satisfied before the Corporation is eligible to retain the contribution, the grant will be recognised in the statement of financial position as a liability until those conditions are satisfied.

Sales revenue

Events, fundraising and raffles are recognised when received or receivable.

Donations and sponsorship

Donations and sponsorship income is recognised at the time the pledge is made.

Interest

Interest revenue is recognised as interest accrues using the effective interest method. This is a method of calculating the amortised cost of a financial asset and allocating the interest income over the relevant period using the effective interest rate.

Other revenue

Other revenue is recognised when it is received or when the right to receive payment is established.

Income tax

As the incorporated association is a tax exempt institution in terms of subsection 50-10 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997, as amended, it is exempt from paying income tax.

Current and non-current classification

Assets and liabilities are presented in the statement of financial position based on current and non-current classification.

An asset is classified as current when: it is either expected to be realised or intended to be sold or consumed in the incorporated association's normal operating cycle; it is held primarily for the purpose of trading; it is expected to be realised within 12 months after the reporting period; or the asset is cash or cash equivalent unless restricted from being exchanged or used to settle a liability for at least 12 months after the reporting period. All other assets are classified as non-current.

A liability is classified as current when: it is either expected to be settled in the incorporated association's normal operating cycle; it is held primarily for the purpose of trading; it is due to be settled within 12 months after the reporting period; or there is no unconditional right to defer the settlement of the liability for at least 12 months after the reporting period. All other liabilities are classified as non-current.

Trade and other receivables

Trade receivables are initially recognised at fair value and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any allowance for expected credit losses. Trade receivables are generally due for settlement within 30 days.

The incorporated association has applied the simplified approach to measuring expected credit losses, which uses a lifetime expected loss allowance.

Other receivables are recognised at amortised cost, less any allowance for expected credit losses.

Inventories

Stock on hand is stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost comprises of purchase and delivery costs, net of rebates and discounts received or receivable.

Net realisable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business less the estimated costs of completion and the estimated costs necessary to make the sale.

Investments and other financial assets

Investments and other financial assets are initially measured at fair value. Transaction costs are included as part of the initial measurement, except for financial assets at fair value through profit or loss. Such assets are subsequently measured at either amortised cost or fair value depending on their classification. Classification is determined based on both the business model within which such assets are held and the contractual cash flow characteristics of the financial asset unless an accounting mismatch is being avoided.

Financial assets are derecognised when the rights to receive cash flows have expired or have been transferred and the incorporated association has transferred substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership. When there is no reasonable expectation of recovering part or all of a financial asset, its carrying value is written off.

Financial assets at amortised cost

A financial asset is measured at amortised cost only if both of the following conditions are met: (i) it is held within a business model whose objective is to hold assets in order to collect contractual cash flows; and (ii) the contractual terms of the financial asset represent contractual cash flows that are solely payments of principal and interest.

Investments

Investments includes non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments and fixed maturities where the incorporated association has the positive intention and ability to hold the financial asset to maturity. This category excludes financial assets that are held for an undefined period. Investments are carried at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method adjusted for any principal repayments. Gains and losses are recognised in profit or loss when the asset is derecognised or impaired.

Impairment of financial assets

The incorporated association recognises a loss allowance for expected credit losses on financial assets which are either measured at amortised cost or fair value through other comprehensive income. The measurement of the loss allowance depends upon the incorporated association's assessment at the end of each reporting period as to whether the financial instrument's credit risk has increased significantly since initial recognition, based on reasonable and supportable information that is available, without undue cost or effort to obtain.

Where there has not been a significant increase in exposure to credit risk since initial recognition, a 12-month expected credit loss allowance is estimated. This represents a portion of the asset's lifetime expected credit losses that is attributable to a default event that is possible within the next 12 months. Where a financial asset has become credit impaired or where it is determined that credit risk has increased significantly, the loss allowance is based on the asset's lifetime expected credit losses. The amount of expected credit loss recognised is measured on the basis of the probability weighted present value of anticipated cash shortfalls over the life of the instrument discounted at the original effective interest rate.

For financial assets mandatorily measured at fair value through other comprehensive income, the loss allowance is recognised in other comprehensive income with a corresponding expense through profit or loss. In all other cases, the loss allowance reduces the asset's carrying value with a corresponding expense through profit or loss.

Property, plant and equipment

Plant and equipment is stated at historical cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment. Historical cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the items.

Depreciation is calculated on a straight-line basis to write off the net cost of each item of property, plant and equipment over their expected useful lives as follows:

Note 1. Significant accounting policies (continued)

An item of property, plant and equipment is derecognised upon disposal or when there is no future economic benefit to the incorporated association. Gains and losses between the carrying amount and the disposal proceeds are taken to profit or loss.

Impairment of non-financial assets

Non-financial assets are reviewed for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying amount may not be recoverable. An impairment loss is recognised for the amount by which the asset's carrying amount exceeds its recoverable amount.

Recoverable amount is the higher of an asset's fair value less costs of disposal and value-in-use. The value-in-use is the present value of the estimated future cash flows relating to the asset using a pre-tax discount rate specific to the asset or cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs. Assets that do not have independent cash flows are grouped together to form a cash-generating unit.

Trade and other payables

These amounts represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the incorporated association prior to the end of the financial year and which are unpaid. Due to their short-term nature they are measured at amortised cost and are not discounted. The amounts are unsecured and are usually paid within 30 days of recognition.

Employee benefits

Short-term employee benefits

Liabilities for wages and salaries, including annual leave expected to be settled wholly within 12 months of the reporting date are measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liabilities are settled.

Goods and Services Tax ('GST') and other similar taxes

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of associated GST, unless the GST incurred is not recoverable from the tax authority. In this case it is recognised as part of the cost of the acquisition of the asset or as part of the expense.

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the tax authority is included in other receivables or other payables in the statement of financial position.

New Accounting Standards and Interpretations not yet mandatory or early adopted

Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations that have recently been issued or amended but are not yet mandatory, have not been early adopted by the incorporated association for the annual reporting period ended 30 June 2023. The incorporated association has not yet assessed the impact of these new or amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations.

Note 2. Critical accounting judgements, estimates and assumptions

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts in the financial statements. Management continually evaluates its judgements and estimates in relation to assets, liabilities, contingent liabilities, revenue and expenses. Management bases its judgements, estimates and assumptions on historical experience and on other various factors, including expectations of future events, management believes to be reasonable under the circumstances. The resulting accounting judgements and estimates will seldom equal the related actual results. The judgements, estimates and assumptions that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities (refer to the respective notes) within the next financial year are discussed below.

Allowance for expected credit losses

The allowance for expected credit losses assessment requires a degree of estimation and judgement. It is based on the lifetime expected credit loss, grouped based on days overdue, and makes assumptions to allocate an overall expected credit loss rate for each group. These assumptions include recent sales experience and historical collection rates.

Estimation of useful lives of assets

The incorporated association determines the estimated useful lives and related depreciation and amortisation charges for its property, plant and equipment and finite life intangible assets. The useful lives could change significantly as a result of technical innovations or some other event. The depreciation and amortisation charge will increase where the useful lives are less than previously estimated lives, or technically obsolete or non-strategic assets that have been abandoned or sold will be written off or written down.
